

#### HERE'S THE ANSWER

1.—Glossop, who had one season—that of 1899-1900—in the First Division.

2.—Ireland, against Wales at Belfast, on November 4, 1933, their half-backs being William Mitchell (Chelsea), Jack Jones (Linfield), and his brother, Sam Jones (Blackpool), who was Mitchell's brother-in-law.

3.—Grimsby Town, who have met all save eight—Aldershot, Bournemouth, Carlisle United, Chester, Ipswich Town, Mansfield Town, Torquay United, and York City—of the other 87 clubs in peace-time Football League matches.

4.—Those of Swindon Town in the Southern Section in 1920-21. In their first game of the season they beat Luton Town at home by 9—1 on August 28, but in their second two days later they lost at Southampton by 4—0.

5.—Woolwich Arsenal, who, in 1907, were fined £25, the Football League also deciding that henceforth all clubs must disburse practice match receipts within 14 days and make a return to headquarters.

6.—Frank Soo, for whom Leicester City paid Stoke City a handsome sum in season 1945-46. Before the post-war resumption of the Football League competitions on normal lines he was transferred to Luton Town in June, 1946.
