## HISTORY OF LUTON TOWN

Club formed in 1885.

Record attendance: -26,362 v. Tottenham Hotspur (League), November 16th, 1946.

Best in F.A. Cup: - Reached sixth round in 1932-33.

Biggest Football League victory: -12-0 v. Bristol Rovers, April 13th, 1936.

Heaviest defeat: -0-9 v. Small Heath, November 12th, 1898.

Most Football League goals for Club: -150 by A. Rennie from 1925-26 to 1934-35 inclusive.

Record individual total of Football League goals for one season:-55 by I. Payne in 1936-37.

Best individual scoring feat for one Football League match: -Ten goals by I. Payne v. Bristol Rovers, April 13th, 1936.

Best individual scoring feats against for one Football League match :-Four goals by-Hunt (Woolwich Arsenal), December 31st, 1898; H. J. Fleming (Swindon Town), August 28th, 1920; E. T. Watkins (Brentford), January 28th, 1928; J. W. Holliday (Brentford,) February 1st, 1933; W. H. Lake (Coventry City), February 19th, 1938.

Total players (while with Club) supplied for International Championship matches :- Four : two English, two Irish.

### D. McMILLAN.

Centre-half Duncan McMillan, who came to Blundell Park in March this year, was first seen by Grimsby Town's followers when he played for Glasgow Celtic at Grimsby in a friendly match in February.

"Mac" signed professional forms for Celtic four years ago and since then made more than 40 appearances in the Scottish Club's first team.

An electric welder by trade, he learned his football with Maryhill Harp a Glasgow junior side.

After a spell in Grimsby Reserves team he came into Town's League side for the first time against Brentford on April 9th.

He stands 5 ft. 11 ins. and weighs 12st. 4 lbs.

## HERE'S THE ANSWER!

- 1-That of 6-0 by Newcastle United against Fulham in season 1907-8.
- 2-Herbert Blackshaw, the Oldham Athletic outside-left. He did so first with Altrincham in March, 1933, and then when on trial with Notts. County in September, 1934.
- 3-William Gorman, the Brentford and Irish International back. His parents are Scots who were on holiday in Sligo when he was born, and returned home a month later.
- 4-George Eastham, the present Rochdale inside forward. He appeared in 27 matches with Bolton Wanderers in 1936-37 and 38 with Brentford in 1937-38, and never scored in either season!
- 5-William Dodgin, the Southampton Manager. When he was given a free transfer as a centre half-back by Clapton Orient in May, 1939, over 2,000 followers of the Club signed a petition urging the Directors to re-sign him, but soon afterwards he was secured by Southampton.
- 6-Neil McBain, who was transferred from Manchester United, to Everton in January, 1923, and from St. Johnstone to Liverpool in March, 1927, and, after being Manager of Watford and Luton Town, became Secretary-Manager of New Brighton, his third Merseyside district Club, in June, 1946.
