

Town's Shocks For United

So quickly did fortunes turn at Bramall-lane on Saturday that the United fans were almost speechless with amazement.

One minute, United were leading comfortably by 2—0, and in the next their lead had been whittled away, and they were having to fight with everything they had to keep on level terms.

This occurred midway through the second half when first WAUGH, who was almost a passenger because of injury, hooked with complete certainty a centre from Small into the back of the net.

Then, scarcely had the game begun than Shanks made a down-the-middle pass to ARNISON, who was through the defence before they knew what was happening, and White was picking the ball out of the net again.

Previously, the Town had given no real indication of their ability to pull this game out of the fire, and it seemed to be merely a

matter of whether the defence could prevent additions to the United's lead.

This they had obtained in the space of five minutes during the first half when McLAREN jabbed the ball past Streten, and then when Streten and OWEN collided in trying to clear and the ball went in off the latter's head.

For their fighting spirit, the Town deserved their point, and again the defence bore the brunt of the work, with Streten, Cooke, Watkins and Owen outstanding, Aherne settling down to a rousing second half display, and Gardiner, a little below par, but giving everything he had.

Until their scoring exploits, the forwards were rarely together as an attacking force, but led by Arnison, they were much improved after their successes, when Small and Shanks formed quite a dangerous wing.
