It does not seem so very long ago when we were last in the throes of Cup Tie enthusiasm and yet here we are again, wondering what is in store for us this time. Last season we were drawn at home against West Ham United in the Third Round and won fairly comfortably by three goals to one—our scorers being Arnison, Kiernan and Watkins; in the Fourth Round we were drawn to play Walsall at Luton and won this match without much effort by four clear goals through a splendid hat-trick scored by Brennan and a goal by Watkins, and then in the Fifth Round we were again first out of the hat with Leicester City as our opponents. What a match that was and no one on this Ground that day has yet forgotten the many thrills which packed that afternoon's entertainment. Our scorers that day were Kiernan 2, Watkins, Brennan and Small one each. In the replay at Leicester, the following Saturday, we lost by five goals to three, our three being scored by Brennan 2, and Arnison. Looking back on those four games it is interesting to note that our forwards scored 15 goals, in Cup Ties too when it is considered that defences are mostly on top. In view of the goals scored against us last Saturday by the very team we are playing here today we are hoping our forwards will again find their shooting boots to continue our splendid tradition of good Cup fighters, and at the same time make some amends for that heavy defeat.

Our defeat at Grimsby last Saturday was indeed a sorry blow, especially as we are so near the bottom of the Table. When it was known that it was level pegging at half time there were great hopes that our lads would bring away with them at least a point for our away performances lately have been very good and indeed have caught up in the second half on several occasions after being in arrears at lemon time. But alas! on this visit it was not to be and our boys simply could not get a grip on the game in the second half. As the game progressed the Grimsby boys played with more and more confidence until it became a matter not as to who was going to win but by how many goals Grimsby would win. It was a very poor ending to the old year and as the Stiffs also lost at home to Northampton Reserves the old year seemed determined to fill our cup of woe to the brim on its last day. We are hoping that the New Year will bring in its wake more Cheer and Good Luck than we enjoyed in the old and trust today's match will be a portender of a run of good fortune. Ups and downs seem to run in cycles for Clubs, and we at Luton feel we have had lately enough of the "down"

and it is time we began to enjoy a little of the "up." The boys themselves seem very confident there will not be a repetition of last Saturday's result, at least if there is it will not be in the "Fishermen's" favour.

The best bit of luck we have had for a long time is the news that Billy Arnison's progress after his operation is better than we had dared hope and it is fully expected of him to be playing for the Reserves four weeks today. This is indeed splendid news for with this particular operation it is a fiftyfifty chance of success but Billy has come through splendidly and our grateful thanks are here expressed to the Surgeons, Doctors and Nurses at the Luton and Dunstable Hospital for the really splendid care and attention they have all given to our player, and in particular we think to Miss Gadsden for so successfully carrying out the operation.

You will see from the middle page that several last minute alterations have been made in the Luton side from the one shown in the "Luton News." On Thursday Wally Shanks had to cry off due to an attack of tonsillitis and as Jack Taylor is still suffering from an old ankle injury the Team Manager had to reconsider his team. Several suggestions were all considered but after taking all facts into consideration the Manager felt that this was the best team he could choose under the circumstances.

Should we get through today safely, the next Round takes place on Saturday, 28th January. The Draw as usual will be made on Monday next following today's games, but if we are again in the hat and are again drawn at home do please wait until you see the announcement in the "Luton News" before sending in your applications.
