

Town Making Change

JINKS AMONG THE SIX STANDING BY

Facing one of the most vital holiday periods in their history, the Town have decided to rely on the team which drew with Sheffield Wednesday for the first match of their hectic programme which involves travelling running into several hundred miles.

Their only home appearance is against Barnsley tomorrow morning, and this is a match from which they badly need both points to give them a sound start to a week-end during which the relegation issue is certain to be clarified considerably.

In fact, it is possible that the question will be almost settled during this spell, for any club in the relegation area at present, striking a bad patch this week-end, will find it hard to recover ground in the few matches which are to follow.

To remain clear of the foot of the table and to maintain their recent average, the Town require a minimum of three points from these three games, and a win over Barnsley would give them a flying start, and give them confidence in the task of gaining some success at Plymouth and Barnsley.

Could Dispel The Relegation Clouds

If they can go one better than that and register a home win, and take a point from each of their away matches, they will go long way towards dispelling the relegation clouds which are still hanging over the club.

As in all holiday periods, injuries may prove to be a deciding factor, and the manager is making no chances of being left high and dry without experienced players on hand, ready to make the journey to Plymouth a couple of hours after the match ends here tomorrow.

Six Players Will Be Standing By

AFTER much thought and consideration of every detail and possible need, he has decided to have six players standing by tomorrow morning, who means weakening the reserve team.

That, however, cannot be helped, for it would be impossible to get anyone from Ipswich where the reserves are playing tomorrow afternoon, to Plymouth in reasonable time for the kick-off on Saturday afternoon.

Six named to stand by are: Stetten, Lake, Gripton, Jinks and Waugh. That should give adequate cover in case of any untoward happening in the Barnsley match.

These Players Should Cover Every Need

OBVIOUSLY, there had to be a spare goalkeeper on hand; Lake can take either full-back position; Morton can play on either flank at wing half and Gripton has been doing so well recently that it has been decided that he should be stand-in for Owen if necessary.

As for the forwards, the manager has decided to leave out Jimmy Jinks, recovered from his attack of flu, for the first match at least, and with him available, and Stobart already in the team, there could be a shuffle in the inside-forward positions to meet any situation.

Then, of course, there is Waugh, who can take over at outside-right or outside-left, and could replace Gardiner for a wing-half position should it become necessary.

They Are Reasonably Safe At The Moment

THE form of the Barnsley team this season has been rather inconsistent and, while they are reasonably safe at the moment, a quiet run of Easter would bring them to the fringe of the struggle against relegation.

Apart from the two games with the Town, they visit Sheffield Wednesday at Hillsborough on Saturday.

They are four points better off than the Town, have scored 56 goals and had 56 scored against them.

Their best recent performance was to beat Spurs at Oakwell 2-0 and their only two away wins this season have both been registered at the expense of lowly teams, Queen's Park Rangers 5-0 and Bradford 3-1.

They drew at Southampton, Grimsby, Preston, Leicester, Plymouth and Sheffield United.

Plymouth Have No Match On Friday

PLYMOUTH will have the big advantage on Saturday of going into the match fresh, for they have no fixture on Friday. Originally they were due to visit Leicester on that day, but they re-arranged the match for a vacant date earlier on.

In the worst position of all at the moment, Plymouth look like losing their Second Division status, unless they can pull out something above the ordinary in their remaining six matches, and the match with the Town will probably be desperately contested.

Their defeat at Coventry last Saturday was a big blow to Argyle, and I gather they did not have the best of luck there.

Hoping That Dewes Will Be Able To Play

GEORGE DEWES was unable to play in that match because of a pulled muscle, but Plymouth are hoping that he will be able to return against the Town.

In which case, Williams, who moved to inside left, will revert to the wing.

Welsh International Squires is recalled to inside-right and there will be a place for the recent signing from Middlesbrough, Dobbin, only if Dewes fails to play.

Following their latest division of the honours, the Town firmly established their right to the title of "draw specialists," for this took their total to 15, the highest in the four divisions.

It was a match which brought fresh honours for the defence, and further disappointments for the attack, which again failed to produce the goals.

Yet, there was a time early in the game when the Wednesday goal seemed in imminent danger of falling, for the Town made another bright start and caused some anxiety among the Wednesday defenders.

Luck in the way the ball ran in front of goal was not with them again though, and the expected goal did not come.

Although the Wednesday settled down gradually, they seldom held out a threat to the Town defence which was equal to everything which came its way.

Before the interval, there were obvious signs that there was more than an outside chance of the Town appearing in a goalless match for the fourth week in succession and no things turned out.

The second half was grimly contested with much of the play in midfield, with the Town having slightly the better of it and Gardner was unlucky with a shot that went off McIntosh's hands on to a post.

Only a last-minute dive enabled the goalkeeper to reach at full stretch a low shot from Kiernan, but taking the game through, there was a scarcity of shots that looked likely to bring goals.

There were even fewer from the Wednesday than those which the Town were able to make and it seemed that the Town, for all their failings in the front line, would be the team to get it.

Certainly, they did not suffer by comparison with the Wednesday, for the Town's defence was compact and last minute to be drawn out of position.

Owen, about whose fitness there was a doubt until Saturday morning, gave another grand display in which he achieved a mastery in the control of the field and left few goals for McJarrow.

A head injury in the first half which necessitated the insertion of two stitches, did not cut down Abernethy's effectiveness in the slightest, and he played magnificently throughout and shut out Marriott almost completely.

Efficient Defence

Cooke, too, was successful against Rickett, and with Watkins and Shanks making valuable, hard-working contributions, the defence firmed up like a jigsaw puzzle, with the result that Hughes had a quiet sort of afternoon.

Best of a forward line which showed more constructive ideas than the Wednesday's, but lacked the vital finishing power which was controlled by the lively ball well and showed clever footwork.
