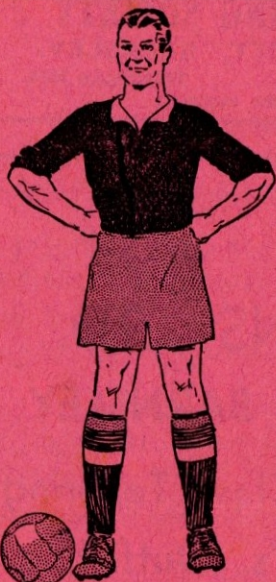

John Archibald Whyte joined Barnsley as a youth in 1938 from Armadale Thistle, and played with the reserve side at inside left. He returned to Oakwell after war service and gained a regular place in the first team at centre half back towards the end of season 1946-47.

In the following season he was a prominent member of the League side, making 37 appearances. Last season he played in 29 Second Division games. After a few games this season an injury caused him to lose his place, which he as not been able to regain in consequence of the good form shown by Jack Kitchen.

Standing over 6ft. and weighing 13st. 6 lbs. Archie has rendered good service to the club and in many a game he has subdued centre forwards who have goal scoring reputations.
