

### KNOW THE GAME.

### Throw-In

When the whole of the ball passes over a touch-line, either on the ground or in the air, it shall be thrown in from the point where it crossed the line, in any direction, by a player of the team opposite to that of the player who last touched it. The thrower at the moment of delivering the ball must face the field of play, and part of each foot shall be either on or outside the touch-line. The thrower shall use both hands and shall deliver the ball from over his head. The ball shall be in play immediately it is thrown, but the thrower shall not again play the ball untill it has been touched or played by another player. A goal shall not be scored direct from a throw-in.

### Punishment.

- (a) If the ball is improperly thrown in, the throw-in shall be taken by a player of the opposing team.
- (b) If the thrower plays the ball a second time, before it has been touched or played by another player, an indirect free-kick shall be taken by a player of the opposing team.
