

CLUB NOTES

L AST Saturday we really did think we were going to register our first away win of the season, especially when we were still two up and only ten minutes left for play. But then the "Magpies" managed to get the ball past an unsighted Hughes, and then the crowd really gave vent to their feelings. They had tasted blood and if ever a crowd helped their team to avoid defeat it was on this occasion. Their cheering rejuvenated the County into an all-action quick-moving side that our lads, try as they might, could not counter. It seemed inevitable that another goal must come from all this pressure and sure enough, five minutes from the end, a Lawton header hit the crossbar to come down to the feet of Sewell who had an easy chance of levelling the scores of which he took full advantage. So we had to be content with a division of the spoils after all. To come away from Meadow Lane with a point is a very good performance, but after being two up we felt a little disappointed on hearing the final result. However we found the net twice away from home, which augers well for the future and will give our lads much encouragement. As a final reference to this match we feel sure our lads would do much better if they were cheered on and encouraged as were the "Magpies" by their supporters last Saturday. It acted as a tonic and we are sure our lads would react just as well if they were so well supported. If things are not going right for us this afternoon just try it and we feel sure it will pay dividends.

For our thirteenth game of the season we have as our visitors Queens Park Rangers, and being the thirteenth game we are hoping that the bad luck which has dogged us so far will now change. The Rangers are doing quite well at the moment, having obtained twelve points from the twelve games played to date. They are therefore in a very comfortable position for today's game, with nothing like the anxieties facing our lads. We notice with pleasure that Ted Duggan has regained his place in the senior side. On each occasion that we have played the Rangers when Ted has been playing for them he has been a thorn in our side, for he had a very good game when we visited Shepherds Bush, September, 1949, the three goals by which we were defeated coming from his good work. When our Stiffs played there last September we were defeated by seven goals to three, four of those seven coming from Duggan's efforts while playing at centre

forward. Therefore while we wish him success we hope he is not too successful today!

We are holding our Annual Dance tonight at the Winter Assembly Hall. It is being organised by the Bobbers Stand Club Committee, to whom we are very grateful. Such an occasion requires much thought and attention if it is to be a success and the Committee and Members have worked very hard in their efforts to make it so. Anyone who is here today is cordially invited to come along, and especially supporters of our visitors who wish to end their visit to Luton with a jolly evening. Tickets are 4- each to be obtained at the door, proceedings beginning at 8 o'clock and will finish when the clock strikes the magic hour of midnight.

Last Saturday morning the Luton Schoolboys earned the right to meet Kettering Schoolboys in the second round of the English Schools' Trophy Competition by beating Isle of Ely Schoolboys on this ground by ten clear goals. The visitors played a plucky and sporting game but were no match for the local boys who got on top right from the start and never lost their grip on the game. There was much excitement towards the end as to whether or not double figures would be reached. This was accomplished by practically the last kick of the match amidst much cheering.

The Stiffs recent run of success came to an abrupt end last Saturday when Coventry City Reserves beat us by three goals to one. Our lads did not play anything like their recent form and were very disappointing. However it probably was just one of those days and we hope to see them returning to their winning ways next Saturday when Leyton Orient Reserves will provide the opposition.
