

### Editor's News and Views

Good Afternoon, Everybody.

I know all our patrons will have shared our disappointment at the result of the League XI's fixture with Bury at Gigg Lane last Saturday when the Bees lost 2-1. Defeated? Yes. Disgraced? Certainly not; for the reports that reached me have been in the same vein: that the Bees outplayed and outmanoeuvred their opponents except in hitting the back of the net. The Bees' lead of 1-0 at halftime should have been by a larger margin and although Bury came more into the game later in the second half there seemed little danger of our losing our hold on the game. Alf Jefferies, who has played so well in recent weeks, failed to judge a free kick (taken in gathering gloom) and the ball found

our net via his hand. Bury's decider three minutes from the end resulted from the second of two corners and so bad was the light that little could be done in the scramble that followed to account for the ball again finding our net. W. A. Clarke, reporting the match in Monday's "Sporting Chronicle & Athletic News," captioned his report with "Luminous Jerseys were Needed at Bury" and then wrote . . .
"From what I saw from my perch in the Press box, you can record for future reference that Brentford are a better side than their League position implies and that their defeat was undeserved, unjust as far as football ability is concerned, and perhaps catastrophic towards hopes of retaining Second Division status," and later " . . . If speed

and methodical passing won matches Brentford would be sitting pretty. They had Bury beaten in both these phases. . . ." Whilst we are all very much alive to the warning re retaining Second Division status, we are confident that the standard of football now being played by the Bees with the necessary finish to the work will ensure a steady rise in the League Table. But scoring opportunities must be put to account, for therein lies our revival and survival.

To-day's opponents, Luton Town, are in a similar position to us and the outcome of this game can have far-reaching consequences. Let it be full of good football from both teams (plus goals from Brentford—forgive me, Luton) and may the better team win.

### OUR GAME v. Q.P.R.

This was a good, clean and entertaining game, although there were all the thrills and tension of a local derby, both teams are to be congratulated on the grand sporting spirit displayed throughout the game. The Bees were two up at the interval through a well-taken header by Billy Dare and a brilliant back-heel by Jackie Goodwin from a pass by Johnny Paton. Our boys were well on top during this half and should have had more than two goals in the Rangers' net by halftime. Q.P.R. fought back well after the interval and the Bees were hard pressed to keep their goal intact, until a fine passing movement left Addinal with an easy goal to reduce the arrears. The last 15 minutes found the Bees back in control and the game ended on a high note with the Bees pressing hard to increase their lead.

### THE FOOTBALL COMBINATION

The Combination XI met Portsmouth Reserves at Griffin Park last

Saturday and registered a 4-0 victory. This is their tenth successive game without defeat and those of you who have witnessed their displays both Home and Away during this period will, I know, readily agree that the policy of insisting on football being played in the right spirit and in the manner in which it was intended it should be played has been worth while. Their position to date is that of tieing for fifth place with the 'Spurs with 25 points each, which serves to indicate that if they can maintain their present high standard, then they can be in at the death for Combination honours. Their performance in beating Portsmouth so decisively and deservedly has brought forth many letters of commendation for their display. Congratulations, lads, and Well Done. Garneys (2), Coote (1) and Bristow (1) were our scorers. To-day they are away to West Ham United.

### THE "A" TEAM

The "A" Team, who prior to last Thursday week when they met Fulham at Craven Cottage, had lost only one match in the nine previously played, slipped badly to the "Cottagers" by a 5-2 defeat. side, including four young amateurs, some of whom found the occasion just a little too much for them. On Wednesday last they met Crystal Palace on Southall Football Club's ground and after a hard-fought game were beaten 3-1.

Prior to Wednesday's game they were still third in the Mid Week League, Charlton and Portsmouth holding first and second positions.

John Low, the Juniors' 16-year-old centre forward, 5ft. 10in, and well built, is certainly a prospect in the making. He has scored 20 goals in five games for the Juniors. Well Done, Juniors. (Kensington) were winning 7-0 when the match was abandoned at half-time due to Again, Congratulations, Everybody.


