




EDITORIAL

HE way things are shaping, the Second Division promotion contest may well be the closest for years. So level in quality are the clubs in the top half of the table that it would not be surprising to find on the last day of the season goal-average calculations having to decide not only the second promotion place, but also the first and the destination of the Second Division championship trophy.

pionship trophy.

A year ago, Tottenham Hotspur were leading with 42 points as against Preston's 34, this year from the same number of matches, namely 27. Today, 13 clubs are spanned by only seven points and half-a-dozen clubs each have 27 points including United.

LOW WATER MARK-53.

It is highly improbable that there will be a margin of seven points between the second and third teams this year. In fact, we may find the Divisional Championship being won with the lowest number of points since it was extended to 22 clubs after World War I.

Low water mark stands at 53 points, the total of Notts County when they headed the Division in 1922-23 season.

In order to reach 50 points we have to win another 23 from 17 remaining League matches. We have eight home matches (including today's) and nine away. If we could win the home matches we should have to get another seven points away.

You'll agree that's a pretty tall order. But not impossible of fulfilment if everybody becomes imbued with enthusiasm. The really tough matches at the Lane—on paper—are those with Preston North End, now on the wave of success, Cardiff and Manchester City, though West Ham can be a serious obstacle.

And Luton today, fighting for safety, will not surrender without a fight. However, time will tell.

CUP AHEAD.

Next week we shall be all full of the fourth round F.A. Cup-tie with Mansfield Town. We are hopeful of success, but not at all over-optimistic. The Third Division clubs are making special efforts in the Cup this season and Mansfield, under the guidance of player-manager Freddie Steele, are creditably situated in the Northern Section.

Our Reserves drew the Central League "Derby" with Wednesday Reserves at Hillsborough last week and are situated near the middle of the League table.



OUR VISITORS
OT so very long ago, Luton Town
were having a worrying time.
They are still a bit anxious, for
they are only third from the bottom of
the Second Division, one point better off than Bury and two better than Grimsby Town. But in recent weeks the team have been playing better and achieving an encouraging measure of success.

A fortnight ago, they knocked out Portsmouth, last season's League Champions, in the third round of the Cup and last Saturday drew with Barnsley. Those two performances alone suggest that the "Hatters" will rise in the table and steer clear of relegation.

They will not spare themselves against United today, for while they may have next week's Cup-tie on their minds, they

cannot relax in the League.

INTERNATIONALS

Manager Dally Duncan, who was so delightful an outside left in his playing days with Derby, will be relieved when dangers are behind him. He has, however, players who should save the situation. For instance, Luton have two fine goalkeepers in Hughes, Welsh international, and Streten, an England international

Streton lost his place to Hughes but has regained it and is on his toes to A colourful goalkeeper stick there. Streten is always good to see in action. He has a couple of capable backs in front of him in Wilson and Irishman Aherne, though the man who seldom fails to command attention is centre-half-back Svd. Owen, who stepped into the shoes of Gager so well that Gager's transfer caused no weakness.

Owen is one of the best centre halfbacks in the Second Division.

Forward results have improved since the arrival of the young Scottish inside-left, Davie, from St. Mirren. He's clever and thrustful and makes a first-rate partner to the South African winger, Havenga, who knows his way to goal.

STILL PACKS A SHOT. Well-known forward is George Stobbart, the former Middlesbrough centreforward, who has an old head on his shoulders and packs a good shot. The Glover-Shanks wing is industrious. And, incidentally, wing half-back Watkins is particularly effective with his tackling and gives the Davis-Havenga wing pretty consistent support.
