



#### CLUB NOTES

A VERY precious point was picked up at Shepherds Bush last Saturday when we held Queens Park Rangers to a one goal draw. The Rangers should have held a most comfortable lead at half time, for several quite good chances went abegging. When Willie Davie scored for us midway through the second half everybody thought the "Hatters" were going to record their second win away of the season, for they were playing much better football and were showing more incisiveness just then. But it was not to be, for a shot from the Ranger's outside left struck Pat McAuley and ended up in the net. Most people are of the opinion that the shot would have entered the net in any case, and we are certainly not blaming McAuley for the mishap—it was just one of those things. However we came away with a point, which was better than at one time we had dared hope.

We have another hard struggle before us this afternoon, the lads from Bury being our visitors. They, like ourselves, are struggling desperately to get away from the bottom of the Table and unfortunately for us seem to have struck a good patch these last two weeks since re-arranging their team. Two weeks ago they went to Upton Park and won by three goals to two, and last week at Gigg Lane met Sheffield United, the result being a drawn game of one goal each. These are two very good performances and no doubt they hope to carry on this good work today. A win today for Bury will be as good as four points to them and this is a position we must avoid if we possibly can. Therefore a hard struggle faces us, but with every prospect of a return to firmer conditions our lads have every confidence of finishing on the right side.

It will be seen that we have brought back Doug. Gardiner into the forward line in an attempt to bring more experience and shooting power into the vital position on the extreme left. It is a position which, although not his usual, nevertheless is one in which Doug, has had quite a bit of experience and we are hoping this qualification will enable him to fill it with success.

The "Stiffs" are doing very much better these days and their performance here last week in beating Leicester Reserves was very commendable. Although the result showed that we won by the only goal scored, our superiority was much greater than is imagined by such a narrow victory, and it was against a very much more experienced side.

The Reserves are at Coventry today and a win there will certainly put us well in the running as leaders of our Section, for out of the six matches played to date in the Combination Cup, four of them have been away from home. We have an aggregate of seven points, only two behind the present leaders, who are Birmingham.

The two youngsters introduced last Saturday to the Combination side did extremely well and showed they can both take their places in this higher grade of football. Jacky Taylor scored a peach of a goal, beating Leicester's Cup Final Centre Half Plummer on the floor cleverly and shooting an unstoppable shot in practically the same movement. A very fine effort and much appreciated by the small crowd present.

We are very sorry we had to call off the Schoolboys' Match here last Saturday morning, but we are quite sure that if this game had been played there would have been no game in the afternoon. As it was the conditions long before the end of the Reserves' match were deplorable, and in any case the going would probably have been too heavy for the youngsters. Certainly their football would have been affected by the thick mud. However we have been very pleased to grant the Luton Schools' F.A. permission to use the Ground on Saturday morning, April 21st, to enable them to play their Annual Seaward Trophy match. The Luton Boys' opponents on this occasion will be the Watford Schoolboys, and it should be a very good game. We are hoping by then that the conditions will be very much better than they have been lately.

We were very pleased to receive the Luton Band again, and although it did not inspire our lads to victory was nevertheless much appreciated all round. The Officials of the Band were very pleased with the collection made and wish us to thank all of you who responded so well to the appeal. The Band was hoping to appear again today but found they could not do so after all. They do hope however to be here on Easter Monday, and so we trust there will then be a further tangible show of thanks for their efforts in entertaining us before the match and during the interval.

We have a very stiff Easter programme before us with two away matches out of three. Last Easter time we had a successful run which carried us well clear of any relegation worries—let us all hope we have another good run this Easter.


