



CLUB NOTES

THE victory our lads obtained against Doncaster Rovers here last Monday will be talked about for years to come and will certainly take its place among the greatest games seen on this ground. After having three parts of the play in the first half and not having anything in the shape of goals to show for it we really thought our changes of victory were practically nil when it was found that Bud Aherne could not appear at all in the second half. Everybody seemed to hold this view, everybody that is with the exception of the ten players. They went out with their sleeves rolled up, and what a display they gave. They were very tired lads as they trooped off the field, having had three hard games in four days with this on top of it, but never can any music have sounded sweeter than the cheers of the spectators when the final whistle blew and victory was ours. What Willie Davie's thoughts were as he prepared to take the penalty kick we can only guess, but we all knew it was a very vital momentfailure we just dare not contemplate. Our joy was no less than Willie's own when we saw the ball hit the back of the net, and then no sooner had we settled down after this than further good work by Jack Taylor, who undoubtedly had his best game, put across a centre and before we knew where we were the ball was again resting in the back of the net from a first-time effort by Bernard Moore. And then who will forget that glorious goal of George Stobbart's five minutes from the end when he connected with a strong centre by Bernard Moore coming in from the right. Only on one other occassion this season can another match be in any way compared with this one and that was when we beat Portsmouth so decisively in the F.A. Cup. We have only mentioned those players who scored the goals and those who immediately assisted them, but praise is no less deserving to all the other members of the team, everyone of them, and to Jim Pemberton in particular for a very fine performance in the now unusual position for him of left back. He certainly did not appear to be out of position and his play was most effective. Well done, lads. never has a bonus been more merited.

We have still a mighty struggle before us to get clear of that relegation fear. We have a good chance of escaping especially if we win today's match with Chesterfield, who are also placed with

us in the danger zone. A win today for the "Spireites" will give them a three points lead over us and at this juncture would probably be a mortal blow to us. However we are going to resume today where we left off last Monday and therefore there should be no doubt as to the final result.

Away-Grimsby, Cardiff City, Hull City.

Grimsby. At home-Luton Town, West Ham

Away-Brentford, Leeds United, Swansea Town, Manchester City.

It will be seen therefore that the struggle is by no means over yet for any of us. Luton appears to have an advantage in that we have three home games as against the other Clubs' two, but when it is seen that they include such redoubtable opponents as Birmingham City and Coventry City, then the position is still uncertain.

The London Mid-Week League fixture for next Wednesday, April 4th, with West Ham United has been arranged to take place on the Ground of the Hitchin Town Football Club. This will help with the wear and tear on our own Ground which has suffered very badly during this very wet Winter due to all the calls that have been made on it, and we are very grateful to the Officials of the Hitchin Club for again allowing us the use of their excellent facilities.

Will you all please note that the time of kick-off for all remaining matches this season has been arranged for 3 o'clock. We are told that it will make no difference to the attendance, and it will enable those of you who wish to go out on the Saturday evening to have a little earlier start. This earlier time of kick-off will be continued next season if it is found to be a success.
