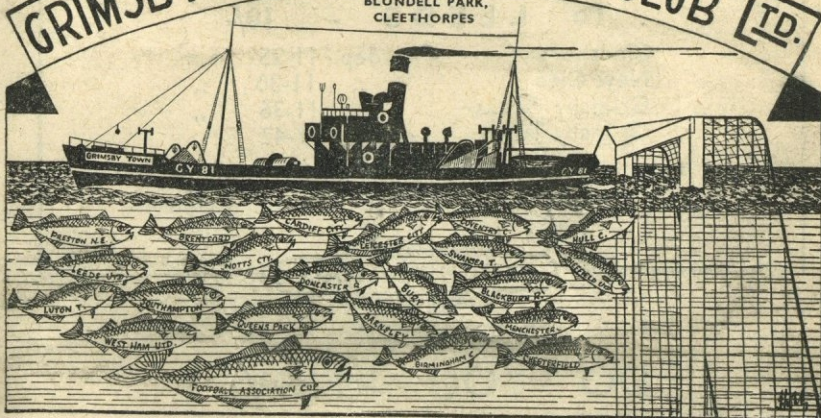

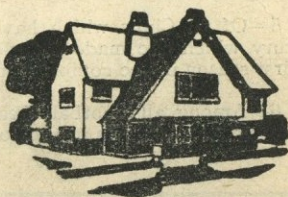

OUR VISITORS.

We extend a hearty welcome to Luton Town today, for in effect the Hatters are our oldest opponents at Blundell Park. They were the visitors when the Club opened its present headquarters here.

It is surprising that Luton should be, like the Mariners, fighting hard to avoid relegation. They have on their books three internationals—Streten (England), Hughes (Wales), both goalkeepers, while Bud Aherne the left back, has been capped many times for Eire.

Pat McAuley, the wing half, has represented the Scottish League. In the forwards, Stobbart cost £12,000 when transferred from Newcastle, while Willie Davie cost the equivalent of a five figure fee when he came South from St. Mirren last Christmas.

Centre forward, Bernard Moore, had scored an imposing total of goals in the Southern League before Luton paid almost £4,000 for his transfer from Hastings.

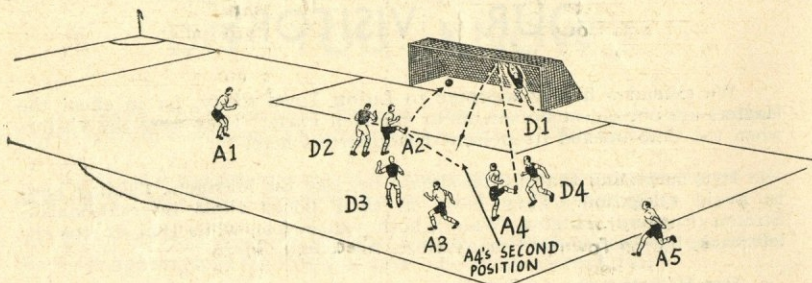

No. 20. THE OFFSIDE LAW (continued)

This week we give our last two diagrams dealing with the off-side law. In the diagram below we have depicted a situation in which the outside right A5 has made a run up the wing and passed to his inside right A4 who tries a shot at goal. The ball hits the crossbar and returns into play. Forward A4 runs forward to the spot indicated, but instead of shooting again himself slips a short pass to the inside left A2 who promptly sends the ball into the net.

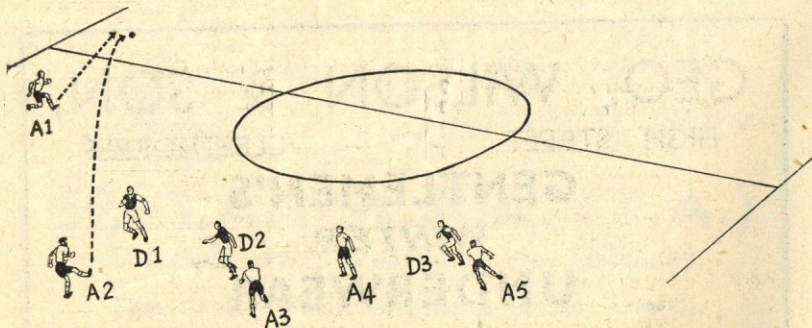
In the position shown, A2 is offside because he is in front of A4 and had not two opponents between himself and the goal-line when the ball was last played by A4.

Had forward A4 shot and netted when he received the Ball from the crossbar it would have been a goal.



In the second diagram we have shown a situation in which the left winger A1 is standing in his own half, but there are not two opponents between him and his opponents' goal-line. He is also in front of the ball. The inside left A2 puts a long pass up the left touch-line and A1 runs forward into his opponents' half and gathers the ball.

A1 is not offside when he runs into his opponents' half of the field because when the inside left A2 played the ball he (A1) was standing in his own half.

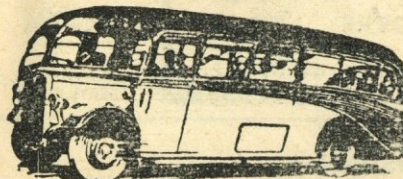

HERE'S THE ANSWER.

1—Ernest Shepherd, the Queen's Park Rangers outside-left. His first Football League appearance was made with Fulham at the start of season 1939—40 and his second with the same Club in 1946—47.

2—That created by Joe Hulme, who, as Arsenal's outside-right, achieved First Division "hat-tricks" against Sunderland, Leicester City and Middlesbrough in season 1932—33.

3—Alan Wakeman, the Doncaster Rovers and former Aston Villa goalkeeper, who, as a schoolboy, played for England six times.

4—Bradford, who won an away Second Division match by 3—2 on August 23rd, 1948, after Blackburn Rovers had converted two penalty-kicks and missed another.

5—Cardiff City, who, in 1920—21, in their first season in the Football League, won promotion to the First Division by finishing second in the Second Division, and also reached the F.A. Cup semi-final.

6—Sheffield Wednesday, who, in F.A. Cup-ties, have met 58 other members of the Football League.
