### CLUB NOTES

AT long last there are signs of the storm abating and that the old ship will safely carry through. Last Saturday's results as far as we were concerned were just what the Doctor ordered, and although we are not yet definitely out of the storm we can at last see the silver lining and all should be well. We always felt that the lads themselves had it in them to get away from the bottom but there is so much that can go wrong in this game that there was always present a big "IF." However the position now is much brighter and if we can defeat Birmingham City today then we should not only lay a bogey as far as the City are concerned (we have not defeated them at Kenilworth Road since the war) but should make our position secure against any further anxiety this season. It has been a worrying time for us all, but as every Club has its "ups" and "downs" let us hope we have seen the last of our "downs" and that we can now look forward to a long period of "ups."

Last Saturday our lads played just the right type of football for the occasion and all the way through always seemed to have the game in hand. It must have been galling to the Grimsby lads to find that no matter how they tried they just could not break through a cast iron defence and try as they might after Jacky Taylor had scored the allimportant first goal to wipe out this deficit it just was not good enough to break through. And when Jim Pemberton took full advantage of another opportunity to put us two up and the result virtually certain, then Grimsby seemed to accept as inevitable a return to the Third Division which they left at the end of the 1925/26 season. They took their defeat in a most sporting manner and we were very sorry it had to be us to give them practically the coup de grace. We sincerely trust their stay in the Third Divison will be of short duration.

We are very pleased to welcome "The Blues" once more to Kenilworth Road, and no doubt we shall witness a most interesting match today. After only two seasons in the senior league they had the misfortune to find themselves back in the Second Division this season, but they have found it a most satisfactory return so far for not only did they reach the Semi-Final of the F.A. Cup but have been near the top all the season and their hopes of a return to senior status is still very bright. Certainly if they win here today those hopes will be further justified.
