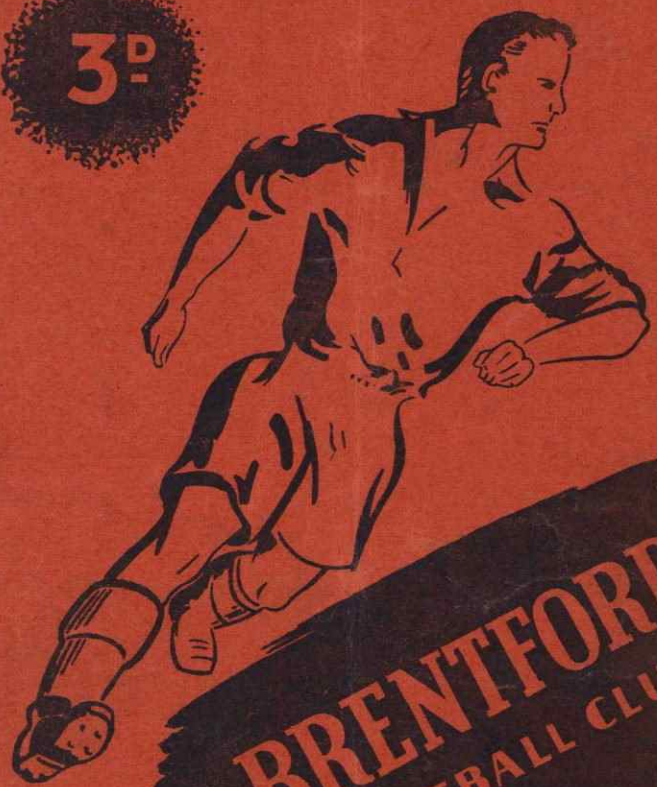

Editor's News and Views

Good Afternoon Everybody,

Following our visit to Kenilworth Road last Saturday to meet the "Hatters" in the Fourth Round of the F.A. Cup, which resulted in a 2—2 draw, we take this opportunity of welcoming to Griffin Park, Luton Town Football Club, their Officials, Players and followers, and whatever the outcome, we hope that it will lack none of the football excitement and thrills as were experienced last Saturday at Luton.

The match was a Cup-Tie in all respects, full of the in-

redients that make anybody's journey, whatever the distance, worthwhile. After fifteen minutes Luton took the lead, following a movement by their left winger, who saw his cross converted by his colleague on the opposite flank. This served as a great tonic to the "Hatters," who continued to apply pressure on the Bees' defence. Numerous attacking movements were made by the Bees, yet none succeeded in bringing about that very necessary equalising goal. Back to the Bees' defence saw Gaskell deal confidently and competently

with the calls made upon him, and Ronnie Greenwood successfully breaking up many attacking movements. Jimmy Hill, Billy Dare and Kenny Coote made good efforts, Bernard Streten's save from Jimmy Hill being first-class. Six minutes before the interval, from a good constructive movement, Billy Dare rounded the goalkeeper and found the back of the net with a left foot shot. This provided the occasion for considerable excitement and congratulations among the thousands of Bees' followers, which unfortunately received a severe setback when Mr. Griffiths, the Referee, blew for offside, following the Linesmen's flag signals.

Half-time arrived with no further score, although the conditions during that first forty-five minutes had been very difficult indeed. After eight minutes of the second half had passed, Luton increased their lead to 2-0 following a solo effort by Taylor. Straight from the kick-off, the Bees went into attack and brought Streten into action following which he was penalised by the award of an indirect free kick for carrying. From Jackie Goodwin's cross, Paton headed back into the centre, where the ball ran to Billy Sperrin, who cracked it hard and low from eighteen yards, to reduce the lead to 2-1, the ball reaching the back of the net via the inside of the post.

Then did the Bees set about obtaining their equaliser, and it

wasn't long in arriving. Following a succession of attacks, Billy Sperrin beat Sid Owen to the ball, and the score was 2-2. Luton made progress from the kick-off when Davies tried hard to re-establish the lead for his side. Turner, too, with Stobbart, contrived to put the Bees in arrears, but Roddy Munro, Ronnie Greenwood and Kenny Horne were equal to the calls made on them, and away again went the Bees into attack. A cross from Jackie Goodwin again and a brilliant flying header from Billy Sperrin just whizzed past the post. Tony Harper and Jimmy Hill were supplying constant passes to the forwards, all of whom responded admirably, and a minute from time, following a good movement from Harper, Goodwin and Dare, the latter bore in from the right towards goal and hit a hard, low shot past the advancing Streten. Johnny Paton flung himself forward, felt the ball touch his hair and then saw it flash past the post inches on the wrong side. The final whistle arrived with no further goals.

There was no doubting Luton's superiority in the first half, and equally there was no doubt of the Bees' superiority in that last half an hour. To sum up, it was a fitting result to a fine game under most difficult conditions. Well played both teams and well done Bees for a great come-back.

At the time of going to press it is likely that both teams will

be unchanged for to-day's game. Should the outcome of to-day's match favour Luton Town, we take this opportunity of expressing to them our good wishes for their successful encounters in future Rounds.

THE LEAGUE XI (Div. II).

Last Saturday week, the League XI visited Nottingham for their return match with the Forest, and were defeated by two goals to nil. Despite the score and the conditions (there was a covering of two to three inches of snow on the pitch) this was a fine game to watch. Thrilling, exciting and with plenty of good football. Wally Ardron, the Forest centre forward, made a fine heading effort which hit the cross-bar, which brought a shower of snow down on Ted Gaskell's shoulders. Billy Dare did the same thing at the Forest end with an equally fine effort, and later, with the goalkeeper beaten, saw Horace Gager, Forest centre half, just get the toe of his boot to the ball to stop it entering the net. Not long afterwards, a left-foot shot from Freddy Monk, which had beaten the goalkeeper, was again saved by Horace Gager, who headed out when standing on the line. Now, we don't say we were unlucky because Horace Gager's positional sense saved the day for Forest, but we do consider we were a little unfortunate, and it does suggest that the game was far from being as

one-sided as some newspaper reports would have it. Well tried, lads!

THE COMBINATION XI.

In our second commitment of the Combination Cup we met, last Saturday, our friends from North London, Tottenham Hotspur F.C. In their line-up the 'Spurs had quite a number of players with League experience, among whom were included Adams, McClellan, Marchi, Uphill, Scarth, Garwood and Henty. The result was 'Spurs 4, Bees 0.

We ourselves were not at full strength due to injuries and players called to the Services. On the injured list is Terry Ledgerton, Tom Kerby, Roy Francis, Wally Bragg and Frank Latimer in hospital. Tom Manley is now covering all parts of the country reporting on players. Reg Newton stood down for a well-earned rest, whilst Alf Jefferies had his second game since being injured at West Ham on November 10th, 1951. Of our other young players, the following are in the Services: Roy Hart, Alan Bassham, Michael Balls, George Bristow, Michael Bull, Jim Towers, Davy Jones, Peter Talbot, Roy Philpot, and George Lowden. Len Stone is still finishing his apprenticeship. From a playing staff of forty-one professionals, we are only able at the moment to call on twenty-six players.

In our match against Chelsea Reserves last Saturday week, the Bees, for fifteen minutes, played some really great football, and took the lead following a very good constructive movement from which Tommy Mycock scored. For some unaccountable reason the Bees failed to maintain their early form and allowed the initiative to pass into the hands of their opponents, who, with considerable League experience in their line-up, proceeded to dominate the remainder of the game. The interval arrived with Chelsea leading by two goals to one. In the second half Chelsea maintained their hold on the game and increased their lead to 3-1, and by full time had found our net on five occasions without any further reply by ourselves. The conditions, of course, were contrasting and difficult, and it was obvious that some of our players were not able to adapt themselves to the circumstances.

THE "A" TEAM

The "A" Team fixture with West Ham, due to be played today at Griffin Park has, of necessity, been postponed. A further announcement will be made in the Programme when a re-arranged date has been fixed.

JUNIORS

In the Middlesex Invitation Cup-Tie last Saturday week at

Hanwell, the Bees' Juniors were defeated by Portsmouth Juniors by five goals to two after a hard game. The Bees were unfortunate in having injuries to both Francis and Jones, which certainly affected the balance of the team work. Young John Haynes, who got both our goals, and Roy Hurrell, Bob Halliday and Denis Heath made wonderful efforts to pull the game round and were congratulated afterwards by their opponents. In return, our Juniors readily acknowledged the football and sportsmanship of the whole Portsmouth Junior team. John Haynes and Roy Hurrell were chosen to represent Middlesex County Youth XI versus Sussex last Saturday. Congratulations, John and Roy, and good luck!

For the information of our patrons, Brentford Juniors will be meeting Tottenham Hotspur Juniors on this ground, on Saturday afternoon, April 19th, in the Middlesex Invitation Cup.
