

#### CLUB NOTES

TT was a very sad party which left Luton, last Wednesday morning, for we were just ready to set off for Griffin Park, when Mr. Jack Gibbons, the Brentford Manager, rang through to say that he had just heard of the sudden passing of the King. Never in all our experience has any news brought such a change on the faces of a party of people. One moment we were all laughing and joking, the next blank amazement, wonderment, incredibility was on everybody's face. It was indeed a great shock. Our first thought after the initial shock was whether or not the match would take place, and we had to leave Luton before we knew this. We contacted Brentford over the phone when we stopped for lunch and as the Football Association had meanwhile decided that the match could

take place, both Clubs agreed that it was better to play the match as arranged in case a second replay was necessary, which has proved the case. We all at Griffin Park paid our Homage before the match began, but it will be a long, long time before we

shall forget receiving that awful news.

The replay proved a snorter. There was never a dull moment during the whole one hundred and twenty minutes. In the first twenty minutes we played as we did in the first half here last Saturday, lovely football all along the line but somehow we just could not get the ball between the posts. Then Dare the Brentford centre forward hit the post with Streten beaten and this set the "Bees" alight. They took a grip on the game which lasted for about a quarter of an hour and our defence were heroes. every one, for being able to emerge with a clean sheet. During this hectic spell Dare intercepted a pass meant for Streten which the mud prevented from travelling as intended, the centre forward passed Bernard and as he saw Billy Cooke coming towards him tried to place the ball into the net with his left foot as he fell, but fortunately for us dragged it just wide. A few minutes later he again hit a post with a header, but we managed to survive and thereafter the game was first at one end of the field and then the other. How the players on both sides stuck it as well as they did under the dreadful conditions was a wonder to everyone. It speaks well of their physical well being, and no-one can say after this that our lads are not properly trained. Even in the very last minute of extra time everybody's heart was thumping with excitement. Brentford took a corner on their left, which, after a struggle was cleared. Jack Taylor brought the ball down the field and was fouled near the touchline opposite the "Bees" penalty line. The free kick came over into the goalmouth, the goalkeeper was beaten but Munro the left back managed to turn it round the post for a corner. This was taken by Gordon Turner and although it was not as he intended Roy Davies got in a shot which was blocked and the very final whistle went with the ball still bobbing about in the "Bees" penalty box. If we are successful in the second re-play there will not be time for everyone to make written application for tickets for the Luton Town v. Swindon Town F.A. Cup Match, 5th Round. We are very grateful to the Arsenal Club for their ready willingness to allow this replay to take place on their Ground, Mr. Tom Whittaker agreed immediately to stage it for us on hearing the result of the replay and we do indeed appreciate this very fine gesture, particularly at this time of the year when the playing pitch requires to be rested as much as possible.

We have not said much about our visitors today from Hull, but that does not mean to say they are not welcome to Kenilworth Road. They are always an attractive team to watch and although they are finding the struggle a particularly hard one this season we have no doubt we shall see some grand football, aided and abetted by the maestro himself, Raich Carter.

And now to again end on a most serious note. Again we have been instructed by the Football Association to post Warning Notices round our ground as a result of an incident at the Luton v. Leicester match played on December 29th last. The Leicester Left Back complained to the Referee that he had been struck in the face by a spectator in the Bobbers Stand when he came up against the rails during the course of the game. Not only have we been ordered to post these Warning Notices, but in addition have been fined five guineas as a result of this unseemly behaviour. Now it just is not good enough. One or two of you are allowing your feelings to run away with you and we, the Club, have to suffer. We appeal to spectators to report to the Police or our Stewards any incident contrary to the F.A. Rules, and action will be taken against the guilty person. We cannot allow our good name to be dragged down by one or two irresponsible people and we shall do all we can to try and stamp it out. Please let there be no further need for the Football Association to take any further action.


