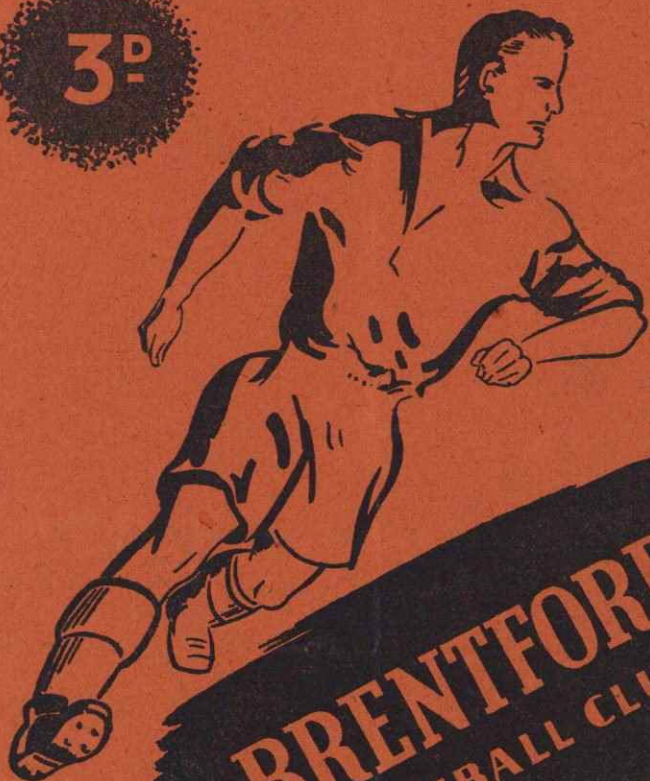

Editor's News and Views

Good Afternoon Everybody,

All our supporters, like ourselves, will have experienced great disappointment at our exit from the F.A. Cup last Monday week when at Highbury the Bees were defeated by Luton Town by 3—2 in extra time. It was a good game and a fast game and credit must go to our lads for twice fighting back after being a goal down, more so when our opponents took the lead within 30 seconds of the game starting, when a harmless looking shot hit Kenny Horne's foot and was deflected into the

net just inside the post. Thereafter play was very even with both defences being given plenty to do, and it was not until the 32nd minute that the Bees scored to make it 1—1. Billy Dare made a great run down the middle and, with Streten coming out, placed his shot to the goal-keeper's left only to see it hit the post, rebound into play, and then be put behind for a corner. From Freddy Monk's corner kick Billy Dare hit it hard and true high into the net from close range. Within five minutes, however, Moore, the Luton centre

forward, increased the lead to 2—1. Despite this second reversal the Bees made many attacks on the Luton goal, their efforts being justly rewarded when Billy Dare again equalised after receiving from Freddy Monk. With seven minutes remaining both teams did their utmost to notch the decider, but at the end of 90 minutes no further goals had arrived and extra time was played. Billy Sperrin, who had strained a ligament behind the knee early in the first half, was handicapped in racing for a ball from Kenny Coote and was just beaten to it by Streten. Taylor, the Luton inside forward, also suffered a knock and moved to the wing. The pace of the game slowed a little although neither defence were able to take any time out for resting, both goals being under continual pressure in turn with good saves and narrow escapes at both ends. The first period of extra time arrived with still no change in the score.

In the final period Dare and Coote tried efforts for the Bees and Taylor and Mitchell did likewise for Luton. The pace had slowed and for a spell play was confined to mid-field from whence a pass was pushed to Morton, the Town right half, just inside our half, who, unchallenged, cut in towards the centre of the field and still unchallenged from just on the edge of the 18-yard line hit a great shot with his left foot into the corner of our net. This goal came with only seven

minutes of play remaining. Bees then threw everything into saving the game and in those closing minutes nearly obtained the equaliser, but try as they may it would not come and as Tony Harper skimmed the crossbar with a fine shot the whistle went for time signalling Luton's entry into the fifth round and our exit from the F.A. Cup 1952. To sum up, then, Luton on their showing at Highbury just deserved their win against a Bees' side that was not working as smoothly as usual. We thank all the players involved, however, for three grand games, real cup-ties, full of thrills, excitement, and good football from both sides and, really, it was a great pity that either side had to lose. So congratulations, Luton! Well fought, Well played, Well done again last Saturday and good luck to you in the next round.

Back now to League commitments. For our last League engagement on this ground on February 9th we had as our opponents our friends and rivals from nearby Shepherds Bush, Queen's Park Rangers, and gained a point from a goal-less draw, giving us seven points from seven games which at this stage of the Season, and bearing in mind our performances up to the 31st December, 1951, is not, to say the least, too encouraging! Our visit to Nottingham for the match with Notts County failed to improve the situation when, after a game which was far from being as one-sided as the score

might suggest, the boys went down in a 5—2 defeat. Three mistakes by our lads brought 3 goals to the County until Billy Dare reduced the margin of goals to 3—1 following a really first-class movement involving seven of our players (with not a County player touching the ball). A grand goal and the best of the seven. In the second half it would have gladdened the hearts of all Bees' supporters to see the lads penning the County in their own half and looking at any moment as if goals were bound to come. And then suddenly a break away by Notts, a Brentford pass intercepted, and Macpherson had made it 4—1 for the County. The Bees were still in the picture, however, and from a Monk cross Billy Sperrin had the ball in the net to make the score 4—2. Still the boys pegged away until with 5 minutes to go the County were awarded a penalty and Frank Broome, taking the spot-kick, saw his shot saved by Ted Gaskell, but followed up and made no mistake with the rebound. Well Played, Well Tried Lads, but watch out for those costly mistakes. Now it's seven points from eight games which just isn't good enough and yet, believing that it's "never too late to mend," we shall be looking for a full quota of points to-day.

OUR VISITORS

Realising that "Variety is the Spice of Life" and "a

change is as good as a rest," we have gone to considerable trouble and no less expense to arrange for the visit to Griffin Park of one of the last eight clubs in the F.A. Cup, THE LUTON TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB. This will be only the fifth occasion this Season when the two Clubs have met and we are encouraged by the thought that unless to-day's game is abandoned (which is unthinkable) or the Bees are voted back into the F.A. Cup (which is unlikely) there does not, thankfully, appear to be the slightest chance of the two clubs meeting each other for the sixth time this Season. Dear Old Pals—but not so Jolly! So, for the umpteenth time we extend to the Officials, Players and Followers of the Luton Town Football Club a very friendly welcome and the hope that they will return to Kenilworth Road without goals or points. GERTCHA!

THE RESERVES

In our Combination Cup Fixture last Saturday week we met Queen's Park Rangers Reserves at home and defeated them by 5—1. From the reports that I have had all indicate that the Bees were deserving of their victory and that every man played a valuable part in the team's success. It is to be hoped that they will gain added confidence from this display which should stand them in good purpose in their future commitments. Our goal scorers in this match were

Bernard Kelly 2, Johnny Paton (penalty) 1, Hughie Urquhart 1, and Michael Skivington 1. Congratulations and well played lads!

Last Saturday they secured a further victory over Southend United when winning by 3-1. Young John Low scored twice (then a missed penalty cost him his hat-trick) and Jackie Goodwin obtained the other. To-day they are away to Brighton Reserves and will be represented by the following: Jefferies; Morrad, B. Taylor; Latimer, Dargie, Jones; Goodwin, Urquhart, Kelly, Bristow and McNally. Good Luck, Lads!

The "A" Team were without a fixture last week but on Wednesday next they meet Crystal Palace at Selhurst Park.
