

Editor's News and Views

Good Afternoon Everybody,

All our supporters, like ourselves, will have experienced great disappointment at our exit from the F.A. Cup last Monday week when at Highbury the Bees were defeated by Luton Town by 3-2 in extra time. It was a good game and a fast game and credit must go to our lads for twice fighting back after being a goal down, more so when our opponents took the lead within 30 seconds of the game starting, when a harmless looking shot hit Kenny Horne's foot and was deflected into the

net just inside the post. Thereafter play was very even with both defences being given plenty to do, and it was not until the 32nd minute that the Bees scored to make it 1-1. Billy Dare made a great run down the middle and, with Streten coming out, placed his shot to the goalkeeper's left only to see it hit the post, rebound into play, and then be put behind for a corner. From Freddy Monk's corner kick Billy Dare hit it hard and true high into the net from close range. Within five minutes, however, Moore, the Luton centre

forward, increased the lead to 2-1. Despite this second reversal the Bees made many attacks on the Luton goal, their efforts being justly rewarded when Billy Dare again equalised after receiving from Freddy Monk. With seven minutes remaining both teams did their utmost to notch the decider, but at the end of 90 minutes no further goals had arrived and extra time was played. Billy Sperrin, who had strained a ligament behind the knee early in the first half, was handicapped in racing for a ball from Kenny Coote and was just beaten to it by Streten. Taylor, the Luton inside forward, also suffered a knock and moved to the wing. The pace of the game slowed a little although neither defence were able to take any time out for resting, both goals being under continual pressure in turn with good saves and narrow escapes at both ends. The first period of extra time arrived with still no change in the score.

In the final period Dare and Coote tried efforts for the Bees and Taylor and Mitchell did likewise for Luton. The pace had slowed and for a spell play was confined to mid-field from whence a pass was pushed to Morton, the Town right half, just inside our half, who, unchallenged, cut in towards the centre of the field and still unchallenged from just on the edge of the 18-yard line hit a great shot with his left foot into the corner of our net. This goal came with only seven

minutes of play remaining. Bees then threw everything into saving the game and in those closing minutes nearly obtained the equaliser, but try as they may it would not come and as Tony Harper skimmed the crossbar with a fine shot the whistle went for time signalling Luton's entry into the fifth round and our exit from the F.A. Cup 1952. sum up, then, Luton on their showing at Highbury just deserved their win against a Bees' side that was not working as smoothly as usual. We thank all the players involved, however, for three grand games, real cupties, full of thrills, excitement, and good football from both sides and, really, it was a great pity that either side had to lose. So congratulations, Luton! Well fought, Well played, Well done again last Saturday and good luck to you in the next round.

Back now to League commitments. For our last League engagement on this ground on February 9th we had as our opponents our friends and rivals from nearby Shepherds Bush, Queen's Park Rangers, and gained a point from a goal-less draw, giving us seven points from seven games which at this stage of the Season, and bearing in mind our performances up to the 31st December, 1951, is not, to say the least, too encouraging! Our visit to Nottingham for the match with Notts County failed to improve the situation when, after a game which was far from being as one-sided as the score

Now it's seven points from eight games which just isn't good enough and yet, believing that it's "never too late to mend," we shall be looking for a full quota of points to-day.

THE JUNIORS


