CLUB NOTES

FOUR points from the three matches played over the Easter Holidays was very satisfactory, especially as two of them were away from home. At Rotherham last Saturday we came away with full points and while we were perhaps lucky to do this if territorial advantage is considered, the point is that our defence never seemed in any great difficulties of not being able to cope with the attacks set up by the opposition. Our forwards did not strike their best form, but a lot of this was due to the fact that Jack Taylor received a nasty kick on the back of his right leg which slowed him up considerably. Yet our lads always looked the more dangerous when in front of goal. While our whole defence played well, special thanks must go to Sid Owen and Bernard Streten for a glorious display, and they both richly deserved the ovation given them at the end by a most sporting crowd.

The match here against Coventry City on Easter Monday lived up to expectations of a hard gruelling match. Considering the conditions of a bone-hard ground and a light ball the standard of play was quite good, and if all our chances had been taken would have made our victory more substantial than the final result showed. Unfortunately we did not come through the match without a few injuries and it was a very different forward line we put on the field the following day for the return match at Highfield Road. Defeat then for Coventry would almost certainly have meant their return to League III status, but though Bobby Wyldes was the first to score and Bernard Moore brought the scores level at two goals all, the City always seemed to have the edge on our lads and in the end we conceded five goals. However there is no grumbling on our part, for as we said at the opening of these Notes, four points out of six is quite good going, and in addition Coventry's desperate plight certainly made them fight with that extra incentive.

We have only three matches remaining to complete the 1951/52 season, and they are all matches of outstanding importance. Our visitors today, Cardiff City, still have an outside chance of gaining promotion and come here no doubt hoping that they will enjoy a double over us and so keep well in the reckoning. Cardiff are five points behind Birmingham City who are lying second place in the Table but have two games in hand on them, so that should Birmingham slip up in their two remaining matches Cardiff will certainly have to be considered, especially as those two matches Cardiff have in hand are to be played at Ninnian Park, where they have been humbled once only this season. Cardiff's away record however is very poor and has been their undoing, for they have only won twice away from home. They are an enigma, for while they have without any doubt the best home record this season in the Second Division, they have also very nearly the poorest away record of

any team in the same Division. For a team still hoping for promotion this is a severe handicap and may prove too heavy a load to carry in the end. We can however expect to witness a very enjoyable game for whatever their position at any time Cardiff always play colourful football and provide good

Next Saturday we visit St. Andrew's, Birmingham, for the second match and in view of our previous remarks not much need be said about this encounter. They have inflicted upon us our worst home defeat of the season apart from the midweek match with Doncaster Rovers, and no doubt the City are fully expecting to repeat the medicine next Saturday. They are a team we never seem to have much luck against, and so much surprise will be caused if we are successful in bringing away both points. This does not mean we are going there with defeat staring us in the face. Change of luck must come some time and this may be the occasion. We shall certainly give a good account of ourselves and the Birmingham lads will have to play well to beat us.

The remaining match will be here against Barnsley on the last day of the season, and it may be a match to decide whether or not Barnsley remain in the Second Division. They are at present level pegging with Coventry but with a game in hand and should therefore be safe. That match in hand however, is an away one with Everton and as they have only one more home match, with Doncaster Rovers today, their last match here at Luton may prove a very important one for them.

For those of you who are contemplating making the journey to Birmingham next Saturday, we should like to inform you that Eastern National, Bunty's and Seamarks are all running Coaches to St. Andrew's Ground, and any information will be gladly given if application is made to any one of these three agencies.

Our congratulations to Jack Taylor upon being again chosen to play in the "B" team, this time when they meet the British Olympic Trial XI, at Highbury on Wednesday week, 30th April. This is indeed an honour and there is no doubt of a bright future for this young player if he keeps clear of
