BRISTOL ROVERS v. LUTON TOWN

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 31st, 1953.

Welcome - "The Hatters."

Luton Town and the Rovers are old rivals of both the Southern League and the Southern Section of the Third Division and they come to Eastville with an unbroken connection with the Second Division since they won promotion in 1937.

It is generally accepted that Luton are the oldest professional club in the South of England for there are records to the effect that in 1890 they paid five shillings per week to three local players and at the end of that season they decided to pay all their first team players this amount. The following season the amount of pay was ten shillings and thus Luton began the spread of professionalism from North to South.

It is worth recalling also that when an Alderman Harry Arnold joined the directorate of the club in 1893 he started a connection which saw him retain the chairmanship of the concern for forty years. Some difficult days were encountered in his early years and Luton football owes a great deal to the Alderman, who was really the backbone of the club.

" DALLY" DUNCAN'S BOYS.

Manager of Luton in these days is "Dally" Duncan, the former Derby County and Scottish International outside left. He made a great effort to win promotion to the First Division last season for it was only in the closing weeks that they fell out of the race and left things to Sheffield United and Huddersfield Town.

Best known player on the Luton books is Jesse Pye, who was obtained at the start of last season from Wolves at a record fee for the club.

Pye, as a youth, had joined Sheffield United just before the war but after a number of games in their "A" team the report was that "he did not appear to be unduly interested in football." United did not retain him.

During his war service out in Italy, however, Stanley Callis, the present Wolves' manager, saw him and immediately reported back to Frank Buckley, who was still the Wolves' manager. Before Pye was demobilised, however, Major Buckley had moved to Notts County but he had not forgotten the tip sent by Stan. Thus, Pye joined Notts County to begin with and then Wolves bought him.

WELL OFF FOR GOALKEEPERS.

As a club, Luton have always had a knack for picking up good goalkeepers. They had Iowerth Hughes, who was capped by Wales twice in 1951 after he had won his place from England International Bernard Streten and now, in addition to Streten, they have Baynham, whom they obtained from Worcester City.

Another outstanding player on their books is Syd Owen, who, in the opinion of many competent judges, is close to International standards for the centre half position. Syd, who hails from Birmingham, has been a capital servant to the Town.

Another well known figure in the side is Jimmy Downie, the inside forward who was secured from Manchester United during the summer. It will be remembered that Matt Busby was so taken up with Downie in his Bradford playing days that he paid £18,000 to secure his transfer.

When they are so minded, Luton can field two Irish backs in Dunne, a former Shelbourne player, and Aherne, who came to them from Linfield.

Wally Shanks, one of the wing halves—he can also play on the wing, was born in Malta. Luton fixed him up for a month's trial after he had been on Chelsea's books and he was retained.

Luton can also include Hughie McJarrow, a one time Chesterfield and Sheffield Wednesday centre, and the thrustful Bernard Moore, who has been at Eastville with Brighton prior to his transfer to Kenilworth Road in 1951.

THE VISIT TO PLYMOUTH.

Rovers, next week, renew acquaintance with other old friends of their Southern League and Southern Section days, when they visit the Argyle at Home Park.

Argyle had the remarkable experience of finishing runners-up in the Southern Section six years in succession from 1922 to 1927. They eventually won promotion in 1930 and remained in the Second Division until 1950, but they were more fortunate then. They won promotion again in 1952.

Rovers took three points from them at Home Park in their two visits while they were down again. They made a goalless draw in 1950 and they won by the odd goal in three in 1951.

There can be hope then that the first visit in the Second Division will have just as happy a result.

Pirie was always too far forward to give proper assistance to the defence and consequently Eyre enjoyed generous freedom of movement. He took full advantage of it and scored three good goals in the first half.

Losing 3-1 at half time the Rovers tried hard in the second half to swing the game in their favour. But three more goals were scored for Bournemouth by Johnson, Hayward and Cherrett. 
