### CLUB NOTES

WE had some very bad luck at Bristol last Saturday when we had to leave both points behind. Sid Owen suffered an injury after only four minutes' play which prevented him from playing in his normal position for the rest of the match, and this indeed was a serious handicap. Despite this, however, our lads deserved to be on the winning side at the change over for they played some lovely football and several shots were luckily diverted to safety. Terry Kelly had the great satisfaction of scoring a goal on his League baptism, but he is the first to thank Jimmy Adam for his work in leading up to it. Gordon Turner scored a really magnificent goal in the second half to give us the lead, and if a shot by Sid Owen after that had hit the net instead of being saved by a back with the goalkeeper well beaten then the odds are that we would have brought home the bacon. Everyone of our lads played magnificently and they received nothing but praise from all who witnessed this most stirring match. Certainly the Rovers will not have a harder fight this season to retain their unbeaten home record.

Despite the fact that our Reserve side started off the season not too well in the Combination Cup when they obtained three points only from their first four matches they have almost made amends since in losing one more match, at Norwich, to finish second place in the Section with the same number of points as the Champions of the Section but with a poorer goal average. We are only .231 of a goal down, but this is sufficient to prevent our lads appearing in the Semi-finals of the Cup. A great pity, but we think they are to be congratulated for the way in which they nearly overcame the handicap of the poor start. We feel sure they will again be well among the leaders in the Combination League Table, the fixtures of which begin today.

We saw some nice football here last Thursday under the Floodlights when we met the West German Champions, Dortmund F.C. in a Friendly Match. We lost by the only goal scored late in the second half, a brilliant effort from outside the penalty box. Our lads had previously experienced some atrocious luck with their shooting, for two

efforts alone by Wally Shanks fully deserved a full reward. But the point is that some most entertaining football was seen which highly delighted the 11,213 fans present. How much the electricity breakdown earlier in the day affected our gate we do not, of course, know but although there was quite a good crowd present we do feel that the football played in these Friendly Matches does deserve a better response. Every one of the matches yet played under the Floodlights here have been well worth watching and we fully expected a gate round about the twenty thousand mark for the visit of this crack German team. The Germans were highly delighted, and surprised, at the applause they received when they scored their goal. They thought it magnificent and most encouraging.

The lads from Devon are our visitors today, and we welcome them once more to Kenilworth Road. They have experienced some dreadful luck this season so far in the way of injuries, which accounts quite a lot for their present position in the Table. They have yet to earn full bonus away from home, although they have on three occasions, at Liverpool, Blackburn and Derby, obtained a share of the spoils. They always put up a good fight here, however, and we remember most vividly that day in February, 1947, when, although not too well placed in the League, they came here and before we knew where we were they were four goals up. We managed to eventually score three to make the picture from our point of view look a little more respectable, but it was a match everybody expected us to win handsomely. As a matter of interest our team that day was Bywater; Cooke, Lake; Soo, Gager, Gardiner; Waugh, Driver, Billington, Connelly and Duncan. Our scorers were Connelly, Billington and a penalty by Cooke.

Next Saturday morning—kick-off 11.30, as the visitors have to travel 85 miles—we are staging the First Round of the F.A. Youth Challenge Cup. Last season on each occasion until we were knocked out in the Second Round we were drawn away from home. These youngsters of ours are playing some very nice football and are well worth watching.
