CLUB NOTES

LUTON TOWN FOOTBALL AND ATHLETIC Co., Ltd.

THE LADS from the valleys of Wales are our visitors this afternoon and we welcome them once again to Kenilworth Road. Although their record away from Home must make sad reading for them in that they have lost all seven matches so far played we have always found them a most difficult team to beat. We remember when they visited us in our opening match of the 1951/52 season and we were coasting along to a comfortable two clear goal victory when only five minutes from the end the "Swans" struck, and struck again two minutes later to level the scores. If the match had lasted much longer we would most likely have been defeated for the Welsh lads were attacking for all they were worth when the final whistle blew. It was further proof of that old saying that a game is not won until the ninety minutes are up. Swansea have relied for a number of years on local talent, and still are great believers in that policy, with some justification. They have however extended this limit somewhat lately by obtaining the services of two experienced players, Ronny Burgess and Arthur Willis, both from Tottenham, to help blend the team together. Swansea's home record is excellent, having dropped only one point to date, so that their away record of no points at all is hard to understand. Let us hope they do not break that sequence today, for if they do they will spoil our 100 per cent home record. But whatever the result we hope to see a most enjoyable game with the spoils going to the side most deserving of them.

After an excellent first half display at Craven Cottage last Saturday when, without any doubt, we should have been in the happy position of at least a two goal lead at half time but had to be satisfied with level pegging, our lads fell away after the change of ends and were defeated in the end by three goals to one. The football from our lads during those first forty-five minutes was well worth going a long way to see, and in fact we have received letters from several Fulham fans congratulating them on their excellent display. There was all the difference in the world between the match played here the previous Saturday against Plymouth and this one at Craven Cottage, which only went to prove, what we already knew, that the football is there if given the opportunity to produce it. Our Reserve side too is giving us some excellent football. Everybody who saw the game here last Saturday for instance when we won by six goals to one must have been pleased with our lads display. And yet there were only 2,779 spectators to see it. There were of course quite a good few of you at Craven Cottage, but as you will see elsewhere in this programme our highest attendance to date for Combination matches for a Saturday fixture is 3,298. The attendances at our First Team matches are down by 16,713 on the aggregate, an average of 2,388 per match, and yet we are the only team in the whole of the four Leagues, with the single exception of Leyton Orient, who can boast of not having dropped a point at home. If this record had been gained by merely trying to stop the other team from scoring and relying on a break-away for a goal to win the match such apathy

could be understood, but we have attained by attacking football, and most of it very good football at that. The poor attendances caused the Chairman to say to "Chiltern" recently: "What must we do to attract the crowds?" which remark has caused one or two of you to write in to the Club expressing your views. The two main themes are: (1) That we want a first class centre forward and (2) That we do not want promotion but are quite content to stay near the top of the Second Division. Now we are quite aware a first class centre forward is our main problem. We who are in the game all the time know this and have been aware of it since we knew Jesse Pye requested to move back North. Can any of you recommend to move back North. Can any of you recommend to us the player we are looking for who is prepared to change his Club? We have scoured the country for such a player, have spent a small fortune on telephone calls, helped the income of British Railways appreciably, all in an effort to find the right player. Every Club up and down the country is leading for just that very thing, and even the is looking for just that very thing, and even the Arsenal have to call on the services of 34 year old Tommy Lawton to fill their centre forward position. We feel we have already on our books players just as good as can be bought these days and we are giving them the chance to prove themselves. Our record to date shows whether or not that policy is justified. The second theme really is not worth denying, but it appears so persistently that once more we must refer to it, but by adopting a different approach. We have a new Chairman. Do you really think he would be content for the Club to stay in the Second Division if by buying a player he was sure we would be promoted to the First Division in his first year of office? The Board and Players are behind him to a man to get promotion, and if you had been in the Board Room after the Stoke City match when the news came through that we headed the Second Division you would have had no doubt at all that it is the dearest wish of all the Officials of this Club, and of the players too, that this be our year for promotion. We invite letters from you giving your criticisms, for we know there is room for improvement, and a suggestion might lead to something tangible, but let your letters be constructive and please, please, leave out the promotion angle. We hope by the above remarks, if not by previous denials of apathy in that direction, that we have killed such thinking once and for all the proportion we must make in and for all. An observation we must make in passing is that the present gates certainly do not give us much encouragement to go out and spend
