"NOT PARTING WITH BAYNHAM" SAY TOWN

More Substantial Win Should Have Been Gained

Whatever the Town do, they cannot keep themselves out of the transfer news and most of the things that keep making headlines are involuntary on their

Such is the case as regards the interest that Fulham manager, Frank Osborne, has been taking in Luton players and in Ron Baynham in particular, to the extent of watching him play on two consecutive Saturdays. Reaction of the Town to this is the same as it was when West Bromwich were seeking him: "We are not parting."

THAT Manager Dally Duncan I was at Fulham watching their Shock Of Two In Reserves' match with Plymouth was in the nature of a coincidence and did not imply in any way that the lown were contemplating an exchange deal.

His interest lay in Jeff Taylor, the former Huddersfield player, and was along the lines of the general Luton policy of weighing up all the possibilities in case they should decide to jump into the transfer market in the future.

As things are going at the moment, with Morton supplying the answer at centre-forward, this is not likely to be for a long time.

Was Not Impressed With Taylor

IN addition, the Town manager was by no means impressed with the display of Taylor and Fulham had a bad day against a Plymouth team that included Hugh McJarrow, appearing at left-half.

So, any talk of a possible transaction between Luton and the London club can be discounted.

Liverpool Defence In Terrible Trouble

THERE could be no argument about the legitimacy of the penalty award, and Liddell proceeded to biast the ball through from the spot with tremendous power.



Cummins Can Be The Inside-left Answer

WillLE he is playing like this, then there is no centieforward problem, and his four goals in two matches shows how he has settled down in a position that is comparatively strange to
