#### NORTHERN SECTION v. SOUTHERN SECTION-A MATCH WITH POSSIBILITIES

#### By Dennis M. Frances

March 16th, 1955. That is a significant date in the soccer calendar for two reasons.

Firstly, this is the last day for unrestricted transfers: after that date, a club signing a player is not normally allowed to include him in their side if championship honours, promotion or relegation or re-election struggles are involved.

However, this season, March 16th has another important attachment to it; a floodlight match is to be played at Reading between two teams representing on the one hand the pick of the Third Division (North) and the other from Thir Division (South). This is the first time in history that the two leagues have opposed each other thus.

It follows, therefore, that there might be more than just a passing coincidence in the fact that many representatives from Second Division and First Division clubs will be attending this match because the players taking part are virtually in the "shop window" and there might be a transfer rush before the midnight deadline on the 16th!

With so little time left after the end of the match (approximately 9.15 p.m.) before the close of unrestricted transfers at midnight it could easily be that the large number of interested clubs present will conduct some fast and furious bidding in competition with one another.

One or two of the Third Division Clubs will, of course, not be very interested in parting with their players "on show," particularly if there is still the remotest chance of honours coming their way this season. But, the majority of Clubs (and this particularly applies to the Third North) will be more than anxious to do business to ease the burden of the summer wage bill.

Gates in the Northern Section have, for the most part, been very disappointing for the clubs concerned and, if they see a chance of cashing in on one of their "star" players, who could blame them?

Two Southern Section sides who certainly have "stars" in whom many clubs have reported interests are Coventry City and Bristol City; Coventry are said to have refused offers of up to £25,000 for 'keeper Reg Matthews who has played this season for the England "B" side. Whilst Bristol's John Atyeo has long been subjected to more than passing interest by any number of First Division sides.

In the Northern Section, Accrington have refused large bids for centre half Ryden whilst Kaye of Barnsley has also attracted a lot of attention and the same can be said of the Hartlepools full back Cameron.

There is talent in abundance—this season perhaps more than in any other in the two Sections of the Third Division and the fact that England's Selectors have cast their eyes already this season on Atyeo and Matthews is indicative of their confidence in the possibilities of the Sections.

Only one club from each Section can hope to gain promotion to the Second Division and by the time March 16th comes around there is more than an outside chance that the favourites from each Section will have forged ahead. So it is obvious that those other clubs in the Sections'who know their chances of getting promotion this season have faded might not be unwilling to come to terms with richer neighbours for the transfer of promising players.

Yes, March 16th, 1955, is a very interesting date to note and, with the game between the Sections falling as it does on the last day of un-restricted transfers, could mean a very busy one for the movement of players from the lesser lights of football to more fashionable spheres.
