### CLUB NOTES

WHAT momentous days these are for us, with each match we play having so much importance attached to it. We were very disappointed indeed having to return from Birmingham on Wednesday last without at least a share of the points, but that extra bit of luck or run of the ball, whichever you prefer, seems to have deserted us lately for these last six matches in particular have been real "humdingers." We recertainly deserved a point at St. Andrews, last Wednesday, but a penalty decision against us proved the turning point of the game, a decision about which our lads protested most strongly, but all in vain. As Peter Murphy brought the ball along just incide the dead line and in the realty along just inside the dead-line and in the penalty box, Wally Shanks played the ball most definitely but Murphy fell over his legs after the ball had gone for a corner. The Referee was right on the premises and promptly pointed to the spot, but we felt it was a baseh decision and or and or and or a baseh decision and or felt it was a harsh decision and especially as there was no apparent danger. Particularly were we more disappointed still when five minutes later George Cummins, right in front of goal and preparing to shoot, was bundled unceremoniously

off the ball in a way in which we thought Law 12 could with justification have been applied but play was waved on. It is just such incidents as these and the manner in which they are dealt with which can and do make all the difference to the run of the game. John Groves at outside left badly hurt an ankle after only five minutes play which reduced his usefulness for the rest of the match— Gordon Turner scored a brilliant goal so bringing his number scored to date this season, including 5 in the F.A. Cup, to 36, but he also had an ankle damaged which necessitated attention on the touchline and the rest of the game being played on the wing. George Cummins too suffered an ankle injury and Roy Davies a kick on a knee, but despite all this, as a Reporter put it "By half-time it was Birmingham straggling and struggling. It took a penalty to give them that old bite and bustle." Our defence after the opening minutes when undoubtedly Birmingham were the better team, found they could cope most adequately with all the "Blues" could devise against them, but we could not again get the ball into the net and so our matches lost for the season rose from ten to eleven.

The only fixtures affecting the above to be played after April 30th, are those two shown: Doncaster v. Birmingham on May 4th, and Rotherham v. Liverpool on May 2nd. It may be that we shall not know whether we have gained promotion or not until these two matches have been played, in which case we shall be in Copenhagen before we know our fate. West Ham, of course, could still come into the final reckoning, with four matches still to play, but as three of them are "away" fixtures it seems most unlikely—but one never knows in this game.

We welcome Port Vale to Kenilworth Road today in their first visit to Luton since we, that is Luton Town, dropped out of the Second Division at the end of season 1899/1900. Port Vale were one of the original twelve clubs to form the Second Division season 1892/93 and, like ourselves, have never had the satisfaction of being a member of the First Division. They have had a varied of the First Division. They have had a varied career, having dropped out of the Football League on two occasions before the Third Division was formed in 1920/21. After being relegated to the Third Division at end of season 1928/29, they were Champions of Third Division (North) the following season with 67 points, staying in the Second Division until 1935/36 when they were again relegated. They stayed in the Northern Section for two seasons, and in 1938/39 joined the Southern Section of the Third Division where they stayed until rejoining the Northern Section in 1952/53, gaining promotion to the Second Division at the end of last season. In gaining that promotion they set up a record which will stand for a very long time in conceding only 21 goals throughout the season in the 46 matches played. Their defence is finding the higher sphere not so easy, although they lost through injury their pivot Tommy Cheadle, but we notice he is fit again and all ready to try and stop our lads today.

There are still a few tickets unsold for the Schoolboys' International Match, England v. Eire, to be played on this Ground, next Saturday afternoon, kick-off 3 p.m. They will not be on sale inside the ground today, as has been the case lately, for the Schools' Officials are at Wembley this afternoon, in charge of 900 schoolboys attending the England v. Wales Schoolboys' Match. Tickets for the Eire match can be purchased at the Office in Kentlyouth Pand of the this match, but as all in Kenilworth Road after this match, but as all tickets are not likely to be sold before next Saturday, arrangements are being made to open cash turnstiles to the Bobbers Stand, Terraces and Enclosure on the day of match. As this will be our first Schoolboys' International Match to be held in Luton we hope there is a good attendance to warrant the Authorities taking us into consideration for another occasion. Tickets are 5/- and 4/-(Reserved Seats), Enclosure 3/-, Bobbers Stand 2/-, Terrace 1/6.
