Centre forward Roy Swinbourne pulled a leg muscle after two minutes and could do no more than hobble for the rest of the game.

Some of the Moscow Dynamo party, having a preview of Wolves before their game on Wednesday, said they were amazed that no substitute was allowed.

Manager Stan Cullis was even more outspoken. "Every week, injuries are spoiling the public's entertainment and strengthening the case for substitutes," he said.

Luton chief Dally Duncan pointed to the amazing coincidence of his wing half cum centre forward, Bob Morton.

"Morton came into the team at centre forward on November 6 last year, scored twice in his first match and held the position for most of the season."

"He comes in today, November 5, scores twice and does a fine job leading the line."

I think Luton would have beaten the full-strength Wolves because in Jimmy Pemberton Syd Owen and Wally Shanks, they have one of the finest half-back lines.

Add to that the crafty, scheming and impeccable distribution of inside left George Cummins, and you have the reasons why the Wolves defence was as wide open as a barn door.

Morton made and scored Luton's first goal in the fourth minute.

Wolves outside right Johnny Hancock equalised, Gordon Turner put Luton ahead two minutes from half time.

Morton, Gordon Turner and Cullen made it five.

THIS was a great game, dominated by Bristol's inside men, three-goal Barrie Meyer and Geoff Bradford.

Johnnie Haynes nearly pulled Fulham through. But it was not their day.

Moscow Dynamo half back Savdunin, who was further down the river at Chelsea in 1945, summed it up for the sixteen other Russians present when he said it was an exciting match, but Fulham didn't shoot enough.

Rovers had the kind of opening that builds championship hopes, with Meyer scoring after seven minutes.

Doug Lishman scored the goal that gave Arsenal high hopes of their first away win of the season. It came in the fifty-ninth minute, when Lishman, after his mediocre first half, struck a purple patch.

Lishman cashed-in on a corner kick. Tapscott's out-swing was just right. It lured Wood out and Lish-

man went in with a scoring header.

Feature of Arsenal's performance was the way the old and new school of players blended in a fine fighting effort.

Tommy Taylor, one of seventeen candidates for England caps, was part of a Matt Busby "mystery" plan, which put Taylor in Blanchflower's number eight shirt, and Blanchflower in Taylor's number nine.

"Taylor was the bait to keep Holton on the defensive," Matt told me.
