

WATFORD ALMOST WON THIS

Luton 4, Watford 3

FOR a long time in this Southern Floodlit Cup-tie Watford, gleefully watched by manager Neil McBain, a former Luton chief, bridged the gap between the First and the Third Divisions.

Indeed, at one time they looked like winning; but Luton, sluggish in attack, seemed to pull out something extra just when it was needed. And that was after a quarter of an hour of the second

half when Tommy McMillan put Watford ahead at 3-2.

First-half goals had come from John Groves (Luton), 2 minutes, Bert Woodison (Watford) on his debut, 4 minutes, Peter Walker (Watford), 41 minutes, and George Cummins (Luton), 44 minutes.

McMillan's goal, which Bernard Streten should have saved, pulled Luton together. Three minutes later they equalised with a George Cummins penalty and then Morton clinched it.
