Luton had won the toss and attacked down their left flank, but when the ball was cleared by Higgins, Lofthouse gained possession.

He put a square pass in the middle to HENNIN, who took the ball forward some six yards before scoring with a right-foot drive, which entered the net just below the bar.

Both Bolton and Luton were unchanged from last week but the crowd of some 14,000 was disappointing on an ideal afternoon.

Bolton had a great chance of a second goal in the sixth minute when Lofthouse tested Baynham with a hard drive from close range, and a minute afterwards Stevens might have done better when he rounded Owen, but sliced wide when he only had Baynham to beat.

Wanderers were the more methodical side, and again Stevens caused the Luton defence trouble when he lobbed the ball forward to Lofthouse, who lost sight of the ball at a critical moment and Hawkes recovered to clear.

LUTON EQUALISE

Luton equalised in the 10th minute through GROVES following a right-wing move which appeared to mesmerise the Bolton defenders.

Turner took the ball through with scarcely a tackle, and when he slipped the ball inside Groves had merely to tap the ball home.

Baynham was injured as Lofthouse crashed into him, but recovered after treatment.

Willie Moir, former Bolton Wanderers captain, now manager of Stockport County, who meet Luton in the Cup, was present weighing up Luton, and he must have been impressed with the dynamic play of left half Pearce, often a sixth forward, who brought plenty of trouble to Bolton.

It was from one of Pearce's attacking forays which ended in Hopkinson saving from Brown.

Bolton had a remarkable escape when Groves, receiving from Morton, hooked the ball first time. The ball beat Hopkinson all the way, hit the underside of the Bolton bar, and rebounded into play, with Hopkinson knowing little about it.
