

TURNER NEEDS MORE 58/59 SUPPORT

Leeds 1 Luton 1

Play was generally moderate in the Leeds and Luton draw at Elland Road and neither of the goals was schemed.

Luton, the better team in the first half, were fortunate to go ahead after 22 minutes, when Cush missed a clearance.

Turner, their best marksman, was on hand to take advantage of this error, and he also went close on several other occasions. If the rest of the team had supported him better they might have forced a win.

Leeds, who had no cohesion in the middle or thrust in attack, equalised through a penalty after 63 minutes. Crowe, their outside-right, was brought down near the line, took the kick himself and beat Baynham with a high shot.

More snap-shooting would have paid Leeds, as the Luton defence never looked steady under pressure. Nor did the Leeds rearguard impress, but Turner could not beat them on his own.

Luton had 10 men for a time after Turner had gone off with a leg injury, but Leeds, in the closing stages, were not thrustful enough to take advantage.
