● With just five minutes left for play, Luton threw a point away when right back Dunne dithered and allowed Spurs left winger Terry Medwin to grab the victory goal, writes STAN HALSEY.

● Instead of booting the ball out of play in a moment of emergency, Dunne tried to control the ball with his knees and fell into a complete flap.

● Medwin nipped in to this Dunne goal-mouth fandango and jabbed the ball into the net.

● Perhaps the best tactical move of the match was made by Luton just after the interval. They switched Gregory, deputy centre for Gordon Turner, to the right wing and brought Bingham into the centre.

● This switch did not work altogether smoothly. But it was from the centre that Bingham equalised Dunmore's first-half goal.

● This switch underlined that Gregory, for all his endeavour, is nowhere near an effective duty for Turner.

● Turner has certainly lost much goalsnap in recent games. For Luton's sake he must recover it quickly.

● Spurs tried to play a double centre forward system between Dunmore and Bobby Smith at inside right. This may have puzzled the Luton defence at times.

● Certainly even Sid Owen has played better games. And there was a relaxing of that great security we have come to anticipate from a Luton defence.
