

HATTERS PUT THE LID ON LEEDS' CUP HOPES

A NEW up-and-at-'em Luton attack tore Leeds United defence to tatters, on Saturday, and set the Town on another Cup chase with a dazzling 5—1 victory.

This was the game Kenilworth-road fans had patiently waited to see; this was NEW Luton. Ninety minutes of cut and thrust, with the forwards taking—and making—chances. And to Bingham (two goals), Gregory (two) and Morton (one), go the honours.

Cup Picture Special From Bingham's first goal in the 16th minute—the only goal in the first half—the Luton fans were on their feet time and again: Gregory in the 55th minute; Morton, the 61st minute; Bingham, again, in the 76th, and Gregory's second nine minutes later Shackleton netted Leeds' one-and-only at the end of the first hour.


