Camera Catches That Penalty Incident



The penalty, awarded to Luton in the 55th minute of the Cup-tie with Leeds, was one of the biggest after-the-match talking points among Town fans. Here is how cameraman T. H. Sheen caught the incident for the "News." Above: George Cummins, Luton's inside-left lies outstretched after being pulled down in the area by Archie Gibson, the Leeds left-half, as he streaked for goal. Referee Reg Leafe was on the spot and a penalty kick was awarded. Right: Leeds players look on anxiously as outside-left Tony Gregory blasts the ball towards the net. But goalkeeper Roydon Wood somehow managed to parry the shot. Gregory, however, quickly followed up and cracked the rebound into the Leeds net.





Where did it go? Bingham and Morton stand in amazement as Wood dashes between them, snatches up the ball and clears.—G1930T.
