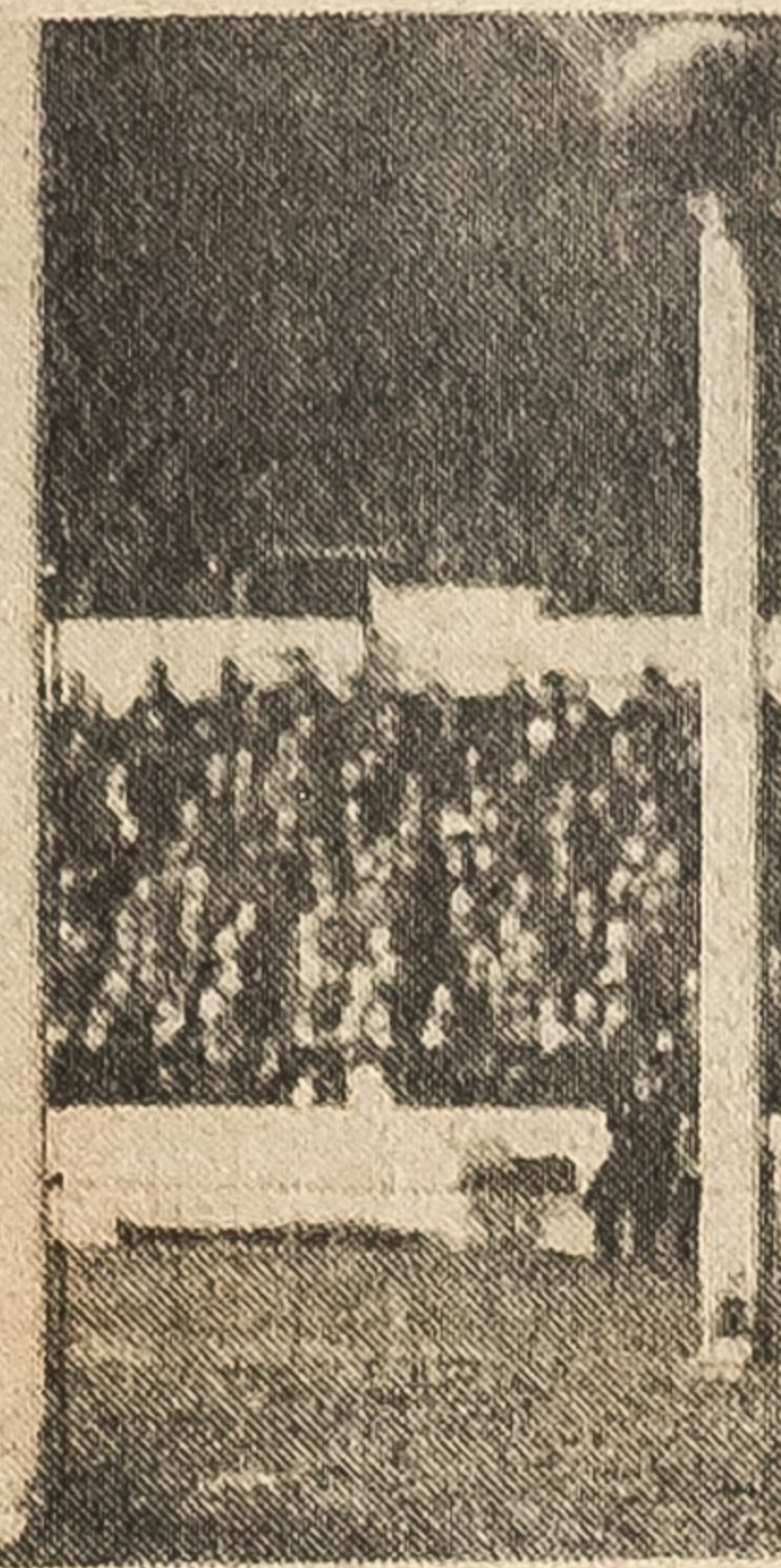


VICTORY— IN THE LAST FOUR MINUTES!
