IT was almost solely due to their Irish goalkeeper O'Hara, only 16 in August, that Luton could survive through a last-minute goal in this Football League Cup second round tie which attracted only 10,502 spectators to Anfield.

Despite the solid defensive work of centre-half Groves, who kept a tight hold on Hickson, the assertive Liverpool forwards repeatedly called young O'Hara into action. Fortune was with him when Harrower and A'Court hit the woodwork.

Liverpool took the lead in 25 minutes. Leishman, the left-half, was allowed to race through unchallenged for 30 yards. His rising 20-yard shot beat O'Hara completely.

In the final seconds Brogan, Luton's young Scottish inside-left, making his first senior appearance, headed a Brown free-kick inches wide of Slater.
