

LUTON TOWN

Manager : Mr. SAM BARTRAM.

Ground : Kenilworth Road, Luton.

Our visitors this afternoon, Luton Town, were one of the pioneers of professional football in the South of England. Town were formed by an amalgamation of two local teams, Luton Wanderers and Luton Excelsior.

Since those distant days the club has had many ups and downs and on a number of occasions the existence of the club has been in doubt.

Actually Luton Town is the oldest professional football club in the South of England. They were founded in 1885.

PROFESSIONALS

They had professional players as far back as 1890 when an offer of 5/- per week was made to each of three local players. At the end of that season they decided to pay the whole first team the agreed amount of two shillings and sixpence with an extra sixpence for away matches and payment for working time lost after Saturday lunchtime.

The following season the wages of the local players were doubled and the captain received even more.

Luton were elected to Division Two of the Football League in 1897. They failed to gain re-election in 1900. It was not until 1920 that the Hatters regained football league status. This time they were in Division Three. In the intermediate years Luton played in the Southern League.

CHAMPIONS

They were champions in Division Three (South) in the 1936-37 season having been runners-up the previous season.

In the 1954-55 season they were runners-up in Division Two.

The ground record at Kenilworth Road is 30,069 which was achieved against Blackpool in a cup game in March 1959.

The record receipts came in 1959 against Arsenal. They amounted to £6,159.

JAMES STANDEN, goalkeeper, joined the club in October 1960 from Arsenal. He went straight into the first team when Ron Baynham received a fractured skull.

Colours : White Shirts, Black Shorts.

EIRE INTERNATIONAL

SEAMUS DUNNE, right back, has been with the club since 1950. He joined from Shelbourne. Ireland and has played for the Eire team on many occasions.

JOHN BRAMWELL, left back, joined the club last October and figured with Alec Ashworth in the deal with Everton when winger John Bingham was transferred.

BOB MORTON, right half, has been with the club since 1946 and is the longest serving member of the team. He is a local born player having graduated through the teams to Division One football.

LOCAL BORN

TERRY KELLY, centre half, is yet another local born player and joined the Hatters in 1950. Previously he had played with Yauxhall Motors.

JOHN GROVES, left half, has been with the club since 1950, having moved from Derby. He played with the junior teams and he too has graduated through the teams.

DAVID NOAKE, right wing, joined Town from Dorchester Town in November 1959. In the two seasons he has had with Luton, this nippy winger has quickly made his mark.

EX-EVERTON

ALEC ASHWORTH, inside right, also joined Luton as part of the Bingham deal with Everton. He is a young player who has shown great promise since joining Luton.

GORDON TURNER, centre forward, has been with Town since he was demobilised from the Navy. He is the club leading goal-scorer with 18 league goals and two in the F.A. Cup.

SCOTTISH INTERNATIONAL

ALLAN BROWN, inside left, joined Luton in 1957 from Blackpool. He is of course a Scottish international and played with East Fife before joining Blackpool.

JAMES FLEMING, outside left, is another newcomer to Kenilworth Road, having joined in November last year. Previously he played with Partick Thistle.
