## ANOTHER GREAT CUP DAY AT OAKWELL TODAY

These are days of rich football fare at Oakwell. Today we welcome Luton Town to our ground in another battle for progress in the F.A. Cup.

And we can be sure that this ninety minutes of football will produce its quota of skill and excitement.

Our lads go into the game with the boost of last Saturday's 5-2 win over Bradford City behind them. But make no mistake they do not go into the match with over confidence.

Naturally enough the team, having had this useful run of success, are eager for the game. Team spirit in the Oakwell camp has never been higher.

### TEAM WORK

Every man in the side is playing for the team. We have seen how true this is with the recent shuffles caused by injury.

The off-field dressing room mood is equally buoyant in this great drive to pull Barnsley back to its former status and power.

Our great worry not so long ago was the apathy of football followers in the town. Apathy is worse than criticism.

But the recent results by the side have swept that away. Everyone has been talking about the club . . . and we hope that whatever the result of today's match the talk will go on with more support to rely on.

### HARD BATTLE

Luton Town will provide a hard battle. Any side which can overcome that fantastic setback in the original game and then turn round and beat First Division Manchester City must have the stuff of which cup success is made.

The Hatters are fighting to restore their former glories and progress in the cup is one way of helping.

Just to switch back to our League programme again. Our lads by sheer

determination have forced themselves into a position from which they can challenge for promotion.

### SLOW BUT SURE

One of the reasons that progress has been slow in making an improvement in the League position has been that the top clubs have been pretty consistent themselves.

But maybe now we are just chipping our way to the top. Remember we have completed our games with Queens Park Rangers, Grimsby Town, Notts County, of the clubs over us.

At home we have still to meet Torquay United (home and away), Walsall (home), Watford (home), Halifax (home and away), Bury (away), Port Vale (home).

With a preponderance of home games our chances are improved. But there is another point to be taken into consideration owing to our cup run we have had to postpone a number of games.

### A LITTLE DIFFICULT

These, of course, will have to be played later in the season and this will make our task a little harder if they become too congested.

Maybe we have got over our run of injuries with the spate we have had in recent weeks and we shall not be troubled in that direction any more to ease our lot towards the end of the current campaign.

But whatever the result of today's cup game there are exciting times ahead for Barnsley soccer fans.

And, of course, the more support the club gets the better it is from all points of view. So we hope that we shall be seeing more of those fans who have not been coming to Oakwell as regularly in recent seasons as they did in the past.

 EIRE INTERNATIONAL

Our visitors this afternoon, Luton Town, were one of the pioneers of professional football in the South of England. Town were formed by an amalgamation of two local teams, Luton Wanderers and Luton Excelsior.

SEAMUS DUNNE, right back, has been with the club since 1950. He joined from Shelbourne. Ireland and has played for the Eire team on many occasions.

Since those distant days the club has had many ups and downs and on a number of occasions the existence of the club has been in doubt.

JOHN BRAMWELL, left back, joined the club last October and figured with Alec Ashworth in the deal with Everton when winger John Bingham was transferred.

Actually Luton Town is the oldest professional football club in the South of England. They were founded in 1885.

BOB MORTON, right half, has been with the club since 1946 and is the longest serving member of the team. He is a local born player having graduated through the teams to Division One football.

PROFESSIONALS

They had professional players as far back as 1890 when an offer of 5/- per week was made to each of three local players. At the end of that season they decided to pay the whole first team the agreed amount of two shillings and sixpence with an extra sixpence for away matches and payment for working time lost after Saturday lunchtime.

LOCAL BORN

TERRY KELLY, centre half, is yet another local born player and joined the Hatters in 1950. Previously he had played with Vauxhall Motors.

The following season the wages of the local players were doubled and the captain received even more.

JOHN GROVES, left half, has been with the club since 1950, having moved from Derby. He played with the junior teams and he too has graduated through the teams.

Luton were elected to Division Two of the Football League in 1897. They failed to gain re-election in 1900. It was not until 1920 that the Hatters regained football league status. This time they were in Division Three. In the intermediate years Luton played in the Southern League.

DAVID NOAKE, right wing, joined Town from Dorchester Town in November 1959. In the two seasons he has had with Luton, this nippy winger has quickly made his mark.

CHAMPIONS

They were champions in Division Three (South) in the 1936-37 season having been runners-up the previous season.

EX-EVERTON

ALEC ASHWORTH, inside right, also joined Luton as part of the Bingham deal with Everton. He is a young player who has shown great promise since joining Luton.

In the 1954-55 season they were runners-up in Division Two.

GORDON TURNER, centre forward, has been with Town since he was demobilised from the Navy. He is the club leading goal-scorer with 18 league goals and two in the F.A. Cup.

The ground record at Kenilworth Road is 30,069 which was achieved against Blackpool in a cup game in March 1959.

SCOTTISH INTERNATIONAL

ALLAN BROWN, inside left, joined Luton in 1957 from Blackpool. He is of course a Scottish international and played with East Fife before joining Blackpool.

The record receipts came in 1959 against Arsenal. They amounted to £6,159.

JAMES STANDEN, goalkeeper, joined the club in October 1960 from Arsenal. He went straight into the first team when Ron Baynham received a fractured skull.

JAMES FLEMING, outside left, is another newcomer to Kenilworth Road, having joined in November last year. Previously he played with Partick Thistle.
