

Luton Have to Fight

THE opportunism of Turner and Ashworth won the points for Luton, but there was little else to commend them and such a clear-cut victory did not really reflect the true state of the game.

Bury gave as much as they received except in the matter of getting goals, and it took some sterling full-back play by McNally and Bramwell to get Luton out of trouble.

Goalkeeper Standen, replacing international Baynham for his first League game this season, positioned well and was generally sound.

A scrambled Turner goal gave Luton the lead after 12 minutes, but there was little further action until a minute from the interval, when Ashworth rammed home a pass by McKechnie.

Standen made the third goal after 52 minutes, when his long goal kick bounced over centre-half Stokoe for Turner to run on to and score with a perfectly placed shot.

Ashworth completed the scoring eight minutes from time with another hard drive after a Fleming pass had got the Bury defence moving the wrong way.
