AFTER six minutes Luton discovered that Norwich football had sunk to a new low. Insideright McKechnie pushed a low

ball across the Norwich goal, and centre-forward Ashworth shot weakly past Kennon to effect the

pattern for the game. From then on the Canaries showed a complete lack of the basic soccer

skills. In the 21st minute Luton, far more purposeful and direct went further ahead.

McKechnie squared a low ball and left-wing Legate raced in from the left to shoot a great goal. A quarterof-an-hour later Ashworth pushed the ball wide of a stranded Kennon

to put the visitors three up. The misery of their heaviest home defeat for a year was capped in the 50th minute when Norwich left-half Scott, racing back to rob McKechnie

of a scoring chance, deflected the ball over the head of his own keeper and into the net.

It does not say very much for Nor-wich that the quality of Luton's football, despite the frequency of their goals, was difficult to assess, because Norwich were so bad.
