

# LEGATE IS LUTON MATCH-WINNER

## INJURY UPSETS LEEDS

Luton ..... 3    Leeds ..... 2

Leeds United twice struck back from a goal down at Luton but, with right-back Hair limping on the wing through the last quarter of an hour, a third equaliser was beyond them.

Not that player-manager Revie and his men ever gave up the fight; it was simply that Hair's injury led to the withdrawal of outside-right Bremner to wing-half and so deprived Leeds of their potential match-saver.

These clubs were relegated together 18 months ago. Now Luton are on the fringe of promotion—with more hope than expectation if this match was a true guide—while Leeds are struggling against further relegation. Though United were beaten my impression was that they are more likely to stay up than Luton are to go up.

### Bremner Equalises

Outside-left Legate, with two goals, proved Luton's match-winner. His recipe: a cool head. Legate headed the opening goal which Revie rubbed out with a long low cross shot. Outside-right Fleming lobbed Luton back into the lead with a 20-yarder that caught goalkeeper Younger a few feet distant from his line, and Bremner shot the second Leeds equaliser from the penalty spot.

Legate got the winner with his second header when Ashworth centred from right-wing to far post.
