FINE RALLY AFTER LEEDS PENALTY ANGERS THE CROWD

Rather surprisingly in view of the news in midweek, McKechnie passed a fitness test so he continued at inside-right and Turner after being absent a fortnight, came back as leader of the attack.

TEARAWAY START

There was almost a sensational start because in the opening seconds McConnell, a 'all inside-left, reached with his head a high ball that had cluded Pacey, and Standen just managed to tip it over the bar. The corner from Bremner dropped on top of the bar, then there was another corner on the left which Standen cleared in smart style. It had ocen a tearaway start by Leeds which had effect of unsettling the Town. Then Legate received an unkind run of the ball in front of goal following a centre from Fleming, and McKechnie had what might have proved to be a scoring shot deflected.

Fleming made a hash of an opening by putting the ball weakly wide, and then atoned in part by a shrewd pass to Legate who failed to control the ball at the vital moment, but the Town remained on the attack and Legate blazed away first-time and had a drive deflected by Hair. Both Groves and Pacey were well up in the goal area when the corner came across but they did not connect. For a few minutes, though, Leeds were hard pressed without the Town producing the knock-out blow.

A goal to the Town seemed the offing when Firming made a long diagonal centre that Tur-ner reached, but the whistle went for offside when Ashworth seemed on the point of scram-bling the ball through

To everybody's amazement—and certainly to the astonishment of Younger—the ball seemed to nang in the air and found a billet in the top corner of the net as the goal-keeper, spreadeagled on the floor, watched it curl in.

CROWD ANGERED BY PENALTY

Immediately after this there was a strong Leeds attack in which McConnell had a header scrambled off the goal-line. Then, in spite of vehemen protests by Town players, the referee pointed to the penalty spot. Why a penalty was awarded was not clear to the



crowd, whose storm of booing was renewed when BREMNER took the kick and made no mistake in beating Standen.

All I can think about this penalty incident is that the referee must have thought a Town defender handled the ball.

Things were certainly hotting up now because with 63 minutes gone the Town regained the lead through LEGATE.
