

Ramsey stays cool as Ipswich gasp

Yet through this howling hot-house, Ipswich manager Alf Ramsey sat behind me like a statue. "I am so used to us going out in the third round that I just write Cup ties off," he said.

Ipswich have never beaten Luton during Ramsey's reign and they fought to the point of exhaustion to save themselves this time. England centre forward Ray Crawford collapsed with cramp after 105 minutes; soldier Bill Baxter—outstanding half-back of the night—could hardly lift his feet in extra time.

Luton never created the openings like Ipswich, but their hell-fire approach—spearheaded by sprinting 19-year-old Chandler—stripped all the poise and aplomb off these First Division men.

It was a shock when Ipswich scored in the 18th minute. A corner was headed out, rolled

gently into the midfield gap, and Elsworthy hammered it through a double line of defenders.

Luton scored in the 78th minute when Rowland Legate rolled back a pass and Dave Pacey ran on to thump in a shot off the crossbar.
