

DEFENSIVE ERRORS LET IN LUTON

SCHEMER IS NEEDED

Huddersfield 1 Luton 2

Luton ended a sequence of four League defeats in a row, during which they failed to score, by taking advantage of two of many Huddersfield defensive mistakes. But their performance can have given Sam Bartram, their manager, little satisfaction.

The absence of centre-forward Turner because of a cartilage operation is being keenly felt. His deputy, Chandler, 19, played with spirit, but someone to hold the ball and dictate the pace is Luton's greatest need.

Disorder in Midfield

Similarly Huddersfield, without Eire international Saward, at right-half, lacked composure in defence. Full-backs Atkins and Wilson have rarely been so uncertain and centre-half Coddington was never happy.

Huddersfield's main failing, though, was in the switching from defence to attack. Neither Bettany, nor left-half Dinsdale, were able to bring any order to mid-field situations.

Inside-left McKechnie, the best forward on the field and right-half Morton, scored Luton's goals and Coddington converted a harsh penalty award for Huddersfield.
