IPSWICH KILL LUTON HOPES IN FIRST 15 MINUTES

LUTON practically conceded this FA Cup Third Round second replay at Highbury last night before the ball was kicked. Winning the toss, their captain, Morton, chose to play into the fierce wind and Ipswich were three up in a quarter of an hour.

By the time Luton's chance came in the second half it was too late, half an hour's storming of Ipswich's defence bringing only one goal. Wind or no wind, however, Ipswich were, for the first time, far the better team, and now they travel to Norwich on Saturday week for an East Anglian show-piece.

With 210 minutes already gone without a decision, the slightest material advantage last night was invaluable and a quick goal worth double its normal value.

In the first half form at last crystalised, a team at the top of the First Division giving their inferiors a thoroughly harassing time. The ball sped from foot to foot in neat, economic passes, the very best of the brand which has taken Ipswich such a long way.
