

TURNER SENDS SWANSEA TOPPLING

LUTON'S forward line were altogether too good for a cumbersome Swansea defence. Because of injuries to five first-team players, Turner made a comeback after eight weeks lay-off with cartilage trouble.

His recall paid handsomely for not only did he score twice but, with his great experience, was easily the most effective forward. Moving away from the middle he often left Nurse high and dry and the smallest crowd of the season were enthusiastic when Turner scored in the first minute.

Swansea drew level after 11 minutes when a centre by Williams (H.) went in off McNally's knee. Not until six minutes from half-time did Luton smell victory again and then that left-half Pacey produced a first-time drive from 25 yards that left Dwyer groping

Swansea Surrender

Turner finally sent Swansea reeling by making a goal for Fleming after 62 minutes and scoring his second four minutes later. After that Swansea surrendered and it was merely a detail that Lownds, a half-back, tried not very successfully at inside-left, scored a fifth a minute from the end.
