

Luton sunk by penalty 62/63

Bury 1, Luton Town 0

A PENALTY goal scored by Mayers, Bury's new right-winger, won the game but this was more like end of the season soccer than the start of a new season. Neither side impressed although Bury just about deserved their win as they launched more attacks.

There was hardly a dangerous shot from either set of forwards. Harker, in the Bury goal, and his counterpart Baynham, both brought off good saves by diving at the feet of advancing forwards.

Both attacks fiddled about too long in front of goal instead of trying a shot. Bartley, on the left-wing, was Bury's most determined forward and for Luton, Gordon Turner, tried hard to put some life into the attack.

After their goal, Bury pressed to the end and the lob by B. Turner, Bury's right half-back, was just over the bar with Baynham out of goal. Then a header by Bury centre-forward Calder went just over.

Morton, the Luton right-half, sent in a long-range shot which was neatly caught by Harker.
