

Luton scramble late point

LUTON scrambled an equaliser two minutes from the end of the game against Leeds when a sliced kick by Turner struck McNally and rebounded into the net. And, lucky though the goal was, it gave Luton a well-earned point for they had had the major share of the game—and a meagre share of good fortune.

They were open down the middle, particularly in the first half, and Storrie and elusive Collins were quick to take advantage of slack work by Cope to give Leeds a two-goal lead by the 23rd minute.

Luton, who had had a good claim for a penalty turned down, got a second chance in the 39th minute and Gordon Turner, who was moving

more freely than in previous matches, scored from the spot after Walden had been pulled down by Reaney.

The home side have made a fine buy in Danny Clapton, who hardly put a ball wrong throughout the match. He and Walden, on the other wing, were in top form but Luton's need is more punch in the inside-positions.
