BREMNER INJURED

Luton T. 2 Leeds 2

Even without John Charles, Leeds looked splendid in attack in the opening stages of this match and undoubtedly would have coasted to comfortable victory but for an unfortunate mishap to Bremner.

With 35 minutes gone and Leeds two up through goals by Storrie and Collins, Bremner fell awkwardly and was carried off with a sprained ankle. While he was absent moderate Luton, who seem destined to struggle this season, came back into the game.

Six minutes from half-time, Reaney brought down Walden and Turner made no mistake from the penalty spot. Though Bremner came back to limp at outside-right for the second half, the Leeds rhythm had gone and in the main packed their penalty area.

No real punch

For all their pressure, Luton never really looked like scoring and when the equaliser came two minutes from the end it was the luckiest affair imaginable. Misguidedly Mason handled the ball just outside the penalty area and was booked by the referee for unnecessary time-wasting afterwards.

From the free-kick Turner was left with a great chance which he fluffed by mis-hitting the ball, which cannoned off the legs of right-back McNally, who had joined in the attack, and the ball rolled gently inside the post.
