The Canaries seemed to be playing vell within themselves, though Ashman wice had to keep a close watch on Davies. By now City were swinging the pall about better and finding their men with a brand of play that had Town vorried

There was applause for Ashman when ne dribbled his way out of trouble between two white-shirted attackers, out Luton were sticking at it and Davies got in a shot on the turf that went straight to Kennon.

Mannion was being allowed plenty of room and by switching the ball out to he right City could always make progress. Several times, however, their raids broke down when Mannion tried an exchange of partners with Bryceand, and found Bramwell quick to ntercept

Allcock had all the time in the world to get in a shot after a fine run by Hill. The centre-forward, needing one goal to equal Ralph Hunt's scoring record of 33 goals for the club, chipped the ball over Baynham's head and then watched it fall inches behind the bar.

There was a short stoppage for attention to Mullett after he had been caught in the face by Turner's boot, but the left-half was soon in action again

DAVIES. HILL AGAIN

Then Davies ended a lean spell by getting the better of Ashman and as the centre-half came to tackle him again the Luton leader sent a shot screwing past the far post off Ashman's oot.

There seemed to be a certain amount of desperation about some of Luton's moves, but in the 41st minute they regained the lead

It was Fairchild, who was using the ball intelligently at times, who once more paved the way and this time he got over a high cross that DAVIES rose beautifully to, nodding it well out of Kennon's reach.

Almost at once Burton sent a scorching drive inches wide, but Just before the half-time whistle City got on terms once more.

Unable to get in a shot, Bryceland switched the ball out to Mannion, who immediately sent a cross well past the Luton goal. Allcock was there to nod it back, leaving HILL with the simple chance of meeting it with his head and putting it into the gaping net. Half-time-

Defensively City had not looked too happy in the first half and as soon as play resumed Thurlow was unable to get properly to a high ball and Ashman had to dribble his way out of trouble once more.

When Phil Kelly tried a throw-in straight to Kennon, Jardine was quickly on the spot and forced the 'keeper into handling the ball outside the penalty area.

BLAZED OVER

Bryceland was showing up very well at this stage and when he got the ball the ball rebounded clear out to Mannion a high centre was nodded down by Allcock to give Hill a chance of a hat-trick. This time, however, the Irishman blazed wildly over the bar.

Then a left-wing centre by Miller had Luton in trouble and when Bramwell hit the ball hopefully clear, Burton slammed it back for Baynham to turn it round the post. More good work by Bryceland saw Mannion fire in a shot that the 'keeper just turned over.

Bryceland linked his way past three men but neither Hill nor Allcock were able to get in a telling shot. More pressure seemed to have brought Hill's third goal, but as he turned Mannion's centre past Baynham, Terry Kelly stuck out a foot to boot the ball away.

This seemed to give Luton a lot more hope and when they came down the right Fairchild's high cross was met by Davies and put straight at Kennon.

HAT-TRICK

But in the 62nd minute the Luton leader did get his hat-trick. Jardine worked his way resolutely through and when he found he was unable to get in his drive, he pushed the ball square to DAVIES who was all on his own and lost no time in hammering in his third.

There was more life about Town now than at any stage so far. Burton somehow managed to rob Turner when the odds seemed on the inside-right breaking through and there were strong Luton appeals for a penalty as Mullett and Thurlow between them managed to rob the rampaging Davies.

The Town leader was soon back in action, however, this time meeting a right wing cross to bring a full-length diving save from Kennon.

Gradually City recovered their composure and Burton was dreadfully unlucky with a beautiful low cross shot that hit the inside of the upright and bounced clear to be turned away for a corner. Then Mannion was put clear and when his centre came over Allcock and Baynham went for it together.

They collided and as the 'keeper was left lying on the ground, the ball ran out to Hill who blazed it back against the angle of the crossbar and there were another couple of shots before Luton managed to get the ball out of play.

DAZED BAYNHAM

It took some time to bring Baynham round and he still seemed dazed when he went back in goal, rubbing his head.

Ashman ran right in front of McKechnie to rob the inside-right after a mistake by Thurlow and there were further appeals for a penalty as the City skipper came away with the ball

but again these were ignored by the referee.

The Canaries had really lost their grip on the game once more and in the 78th minute Davies struck again as play seemed to be degenerating into a rough-and-tumble.

The Town leader broke clear to the left of the City goal and when Ashman tried to tackle him, pushed the ball to Turner. Then, running clear. DAVIES took the return to slam in his fourth goal of the match.

Nothing that City did went right for them now, for Luton were massing their forces in the penalty area whenever danger threatened. Baynham saved at the foot of the post from Mannion and Burton, and rain had replaced the earlier sunshine when Burton hit another long shot well wide

HILL CLEAR

A neat header by Miller put Allcock in possession, but he got right underneath his shot and sent the ball into the crowd. Ashman was pressing forward whenever he could, but before he did get in a shot straight into Baynham's arms, a Phil Kelly chip put Hill clear. As the inside-left hit the ball Baynham threw himself forward and
