

Luton have no luck

LEEDS' tenth consecutive home win enabled them to stay well placed in the promotion race. But their display against lowly Luton could not be ranked as one of their best.

Until Storrie scored the third goal in the last seconds Leeds had plenty of anxious moments against moderate opposition. Not much went right for Luton. In the first half Davies, the Luton centre-forward, hit an upright and in the second period Clapton crashed a shot against the bar.

To add to their misfortune, Baynham marred a grand display as Luton goalkeeper with a tragic error which "presented" Weston with the chance of scoring the second Leeds goal early in the second half.

The most dangerous forward was Storrie the Leeds spearhead, who showed his menace early by snapping up a chance to beat Baynham after seven minutes.

Good defensive displays were given by centre-half Charlton and Kelly against lively opponents. It was well for Leeds that Charlton was in bright form, because his wing-half colleagues have often been seen in a better light. Luton were at their best in breakaway raids featuring Davies and Lornie.
