LEEDS HOPES INCREASE

Leeds 3 Luton 0

As Leeds' promotion hopes rise, relegation fears increase at Luton, but there were scarcely three goals between the sides in a keen match at Elland Road, but Leeds, producing the greater striking power, looked considerably the more in form.

Storrie, the Leeds centre-forward who scored two of their goals, again looked a bargain signing at a £15,000 fee from Airdrie. He has developed into one of the most dangerous spearheads in the Second Division and might well have doubled his total against a not very impressive Luton rearguard.

With the return of Weston after a four-match absence through injury, Leeds had a punch at close quarters which Luton could never equal. Weston showed his value as an opportunist by the way he seized on Baynham's only error to score.

Luton, outplayed for long periods, were unable to maintain their recent improvement but little went right for them. Davies, their most persistent forward, hit a post in the first half
